1 AN ACT Relating to professional certification of teachers; adding 2 a new section to chapter 28A.410 RCW; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes the importance of ongoing professional development and growth for teachers with the goal of improving student achievement. It is the intent of the legislature to ensure that professional certification is administered in such a way as to ensure that the professional development and growth of individual teachers is directly aligned to their current and future teaching responsibilities as professional educators.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28A.410
12 RCW to read as follows:

13 The agency responsible for educator certification shall adopt rules 14 for professional certification that:

(1) Provide maximum program choice for applicants, promote portability among programs, and promote maximum efficiency for applicants in attaining professional certification; (2) Require professional certification no earlier than the fifth
 year following the year that the teacher first completes provisional
 status, with an automatic two-year extension upon enrollment;

4 (3) Grant professional certification to any teacher who attains
5 certification from the national board for professional teaching
6 standards;

7 (4) Permit any teacher currently enrolled in or participating in a
8 program leading to professional certification to continue the program
9 under administrative rules in place when the teacher began the program;

10 (5) Provide criteria for the approval of educational service 11 districts, beginning no later than August 31, 2007, to offer programs 12 leading to professional certification. The rules shall be written to 13 encourage institutions of higher education and educational service 14 districts to partner with local school districts or consortia of school 15 districts, as appropriate, to provide instruction for teachers seeking 16 professional certification;

17 (6) Encourage institutions of higher education to offer 18 professional certificate coursework as continuing education credit 19 hours. This shall not prevent an institution of higher education from 20 providing the option of including the professional certification 21 requirements as part of a master's degree program;

(7) Provide criteria for a liaison relationship between approvedprograms and school districts in which applicants are employed;

24 (8) Identify an expedited professional certification process for 25 out-of-state teachers who have five years or more of successful teaching experience to demonstrate skills and impact on student 26 27 learning commensurate with Washington requirements for professional certification. The rules may require these teachers, within one year 28 of the time they begin to teach in the state's public schools, take a 29 course in or show evidence that they can teach to the state's essential 30 academic learning requirements; and 31

(9) Identify an evaluation process of approved programs that includes a review of the program coursework and applicant coursework load requirements, linkages of programs to individual teacher professional growth plans, linkages to school district and school improvement plans, and, to the extent possible, linkages to school district professional enrichment and growth programs for teachers, where such programs are in place in school districts. The agency shall

1 provide a preliminary report on the evaluation process to the senate 2 and house of representatives committees on education policy by November 3 1, 2005. The board shall identify:

4 (a) A process for awarding conditional approval of a program that
5 shall include annual evaluations of the program until the program is
6 awarded full approval;

7 (b) A less intensive evaluation cycle every three years once a 8 program receives full approval unless the responsible agency has reason 9 to intensify the evaluation;

10 (c) A method for investigating programs that have received numerous 11 complaints from students enrolled in the program and from those 12 recently completing the program;

13 (d) A method for investigating programs at the reasonable 14 discretion of the agency; and

(e) A method for using, in the evaluation, both program completer
 satisfaction responses and data on the impact of educators who have
 obtained professional certification on student work and achievement.

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
