1 AN ACT Relating to learning assistance program distribution
2 formula; and amending RCW 28A.165.055.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.165.055 and 2004 c 20 s 6 are each amended to read
5 as follows:

6 Each school district with an approved program is eligible for state
7 funds provided for the learning assistance program. The funds shall be
8 appropriated for the learning assistance program in accordance with the
9 biennial appropriations act. The distribution formula is for school
10 district allocation purposes only. The distribution formula shall be
11 based on ~~((an assessment of students and on))~~ one or more family income
12 factors measuring economic need. ~~((Beginning with the 2005-06 school
13 year, fifty percent of the distribution formula shall be based on an
14 assessment of students and fifty percent shall be based on one or more
15 family income factors measuring economic need.))~~
