- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.155
- 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 The legislature finds an urgent and substantial need to enhance the
- 8 development of all infants and toddlers with disabilities in Washington
- 9 in order to minimize developmental delays and to maximize individual
- 10 potential for learning and functioning.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.155
- 12 RCW to read as follows:
- 13 (1) By September 1, 2009, each school district shall provide or
- 14 contract for early intervention services to all eligible children with
- 15 disabilities from birth to three years of age. Eligibility shall be
- 16 determined according to Part C of the federal individuals with
- 17 disabilities education act and as specified in the Washington
- 18 Administrative Code. School districts shall provide or contract for

- 1 early intervention services in partnership with local birth-to-three
- 2 lead agencies and birth-to-three providers. Services provided under
- 3 this section shall not supplant services or funding currently provided
- 4 in the state for early intervention services to eligible children with
- 5 disabilities from birth to three years of age. The state-designated
- 6 birth-to-three lead agency shall be payor of last resort for birth-to-
- 7 three early intervention services provided under this section.
- 8 (2) The services in this section are not part of the state's
- 9 program of basic education pursuant to Article IX of the state

- 11 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.155.070 and 1995 c 77 s 13 are each amended to 12 read as follows:
- 13 Special educational and training programs provided by the state and
- 14 the school districts thereof for children with disabilities ((may))
- 15 <u>shall</u> be extended to include children of preschool age. School
- 16 districts ((which extend such special programs to children of preschool
- $17 ext{age}$ )) shall be entitled to the regular apportionments from state and
- 18 county school funds, as provided by law, and in addition to allocations
- 19 from state excess cost funds made available for such special services
- 20 for those children with disabilities who are given such special
- 21 services.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** Section 3 of this act takes effect September
- 23 1, 2009.
