- 1 AN ACT Relating to failing to summon assistance; adding new
- 2 sections to chapter 9A.36 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 9A.36 RCW to read as follows:
  - A person is guilty of the crime of failing to summon assistance if:
- 7 (1) He or she was present when a crime was committed against 8 another person; and
- 9 (2) He or she knows that the other person has suffered substantial 10 bodily harm as a result of the crime committed against the other person 11 and that the other person is in need of assistance; and
- 12 (3) He or she could reasonably summon assistance for the person in 13 need without danger to himself or herself and without interference with 14 an important duty owed to a third party; and
- 15 (4) He or she fails to summon assistance for the person in need; 16 and
- 17 (5) Another person is not summoning or has not summoned assistance 18 for the person in need of such assistance.

- 3 A violation of section 1 of this act is a misdemeanor.
