AN ACT Relating to vehicle licensing and registration; amending RCW 46.63.020; reenacting and amending RCW 46.16.010; creating new sections; prescribing penalties; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. When a person establishes residency in this 6 state, unless otherwise exempt by statute, the person must register any 7 vehicles to be operated on public highways, and pay all required 8 licensing fees and taxes. Washington residents must renew vehicle 9 registrations annually as well. The intent of this act is to increase 10 the monetary penalties associated with failure to properly register 11 vehicles in the state of Washington.

Sec. 2. RCW 46.16.010 and 2003 c 353 s 8 and 2003 c 53 s 238 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) It is unlawful for a person to operate any vehicle over and along a public highway of this state without first having obtained and having in full force and effect a current and proper vehicle license and display vehicle license number plates therefor as by this chapter provided.

(2) Failure to make initial registration before operation on the 1 2 highways of this state is a ((misdemeanor)) traffic infraction, and any person ((convicted thereof must be punished by)) committing this 3 infraction shall pay a ((fine)) penalty of ((no less than three hundred 4 thirty)) five hundred twenty-nine dollars, no part of which may be 5 suspended or deferred. б

(3) Failure to renew an expired registration before operation on 7 the highways of this state is a traffic infraction. 8

(4) The licensing of a vehicle in another state by a resident of 9 10 this state, as defined in RCW 46.16.028, evading the payment of any tax or license fee imposed in connection with registration, is a gross 11 12 misdemeanor punishable as follows:

13 (a) For a first offense, up to one year in the county jail and payment of a fine ((equal to)) of five hundred twenty-nine dollars plus 14 twice the amount of delinquent taxes and fees, no part of which may be 15 16 suspended or deferred;

17 (b) For a second or subsequent offense, up to one year in the county jail and payment of a fine ((equal to)) of five hundred twenty-18 nine dollars plus four times the amount of delinquent taxes and fees, 19 no part of which may be suspended or deferred; 20

21 (c) For fines levied under (b) of this subsection, an amount equal 22 to the avoided taxes and fees owed will be deposited in the vehicle licensing fraud account created in the state treasury; 23

24 (d) The avoided taxes and fees shall be deposited and distributed 25 in the same manner as if the taxes and fees were properly paid in a timely fashion. 26

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(5) These provisions shall not apply to the following vehicles:

(a) Motorized foot scooters; 28

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(b) Electric-assisted bicycles;

(c) Farm vehicles if operated within a radius of fifteen miles of 30 31 the farm where principally used or garaged, farm tractors and farm 32 implements including trailers designed as cook or bunk houses used exclusively for animal herding temporarily operating or drawn upon the 33 public highways, and trailers used exclusively to transport farm 34 implements from one farm to another during the daylight hours or at 35 night when such equipment has lights that comply with the law; 36

37 Spray or fertilizer applicator rigs designed and used (d) 38 exclusively for spraying or fertilization in the conduct of 1 agricultural operations and not primarily for the purpose of 2 transportation, and nurse rigs or equipment auxiliary to the use of and 3 designed or modified for the fueling, repairing, or loading of spray 4 and fertilizer applicator rigs and not used, designed, or modified 5 primarily for the purpose of transportation;

6 (e) Fork lifts operated during daylight hours on public highways 7 adjacent to and within five hundred feet of the warehouses which they 8 serve: PROVIDED FURTHER, That these provisions shall not apply to 9 vehicles used by the state parks and recreation commission exclusively 10 for park maintenance and operations upon public highways within state 11 parks;

12 (f) "Special highway construction equipment" defined as follows: 13 Any vehicle which is designed and used primarily for grading of 14 highways, paving of highways, earth moving, and other construction work 15 on highways and which is not designed or used primarily for the transportation of persons or property on a public highway and which is 16 17 only incidentally operated or moved over the highway. It includes, but 18 is not limited to, road construction and maintenance machinery so designed and used such as portable air compressors, air drills, asphalt 19 spreaders, bituminous mixers, bucket loaders, track laying tractors, 20 21 ditchers, leveling graders, finishing machines, motor graders, paving 22 mixers, road rollers, scarifiers, earth moving scrapers and carryalls, lighting plants, welders, pumps, power shovels and draglines, self-23 24 propelled and tractor-drawn earth moving equipment and machinery, 25 including dump trucks and tractor-dump trailer combinations which 26 either (i) are in excess of the legal width, or (ii) which, because of 27 their length, height, or unladen weight, may not be moved on a public highway without the permit specified in RCW 46.44.090 and which are not 28 operated laden except within the boundaries of the project limits as 29 defined by the contract, and other similar types of construction 30 equipment, or (iii) which are driven or moved upon a public highway 31 32 only for the purpose of crossing such highway from one property to another, provided such movement does not exceed five hundred feet and 33 34 the vehicle is equipped with wheels or pads which will not damage the 35 roadway surface.

36 Exclusions:

37 "Special highway construction equipment" does not include any of 38 the following:

Dump trucks originally designed to comply with the legal size and weight provisions of this code notwithstanding any subsequent modification which would require a permit, as specified in RCW 46.44.090, to operate such vehicles on a public highway, including trailers, truck-mounted transit mixers, cranes and shovels, or other vehicles designed for the transportation of persons or property to which machinery has been attached.

8 (6) The following vehicles, whether operated solo or in 9 combination, are exempt from license registration and displaying 10 license plates as required by this chapter:

(a) A converter gear used to convert a semitrailer into a trailer or a two-axle truck or tractor into a three or more axle truck or tractor or used in any other manner to increase the number of axles of a vehicle. Converter gear includes an auxiliary axle, booster axle, dolly, and jeep axle.

(b) A tow dolly that is used for towing a motor vehicle behind another motor vehicle. The front or rear wheels of the towed vehicle are secured to and rest on the tow dolly that is attached to the towing vehicle by a tow bar.

20 <u>(7)(a) A motor vehicle subject to initial or renewal registration</u>
21 under this section shall not be registered to a natural person unless
22 the person at time of application:

(i) Presents an unexpired Washington state driver's license; or
 (ii) Certifies that he or she is:

25 (A) A Washington resident who does not operate a motor vehicle on 26 public roads; or

27 <u>(B) Exempt from the requirement to obtain a Washington state</u> 28 <u>driver's license under RCW 46.20.025.</u>

29 (b) For shared or joint ownership, the department will set up 30 procedures to verify that all owners meet the requirements of this 31 subsection.

32 (c) A person falsifying residency is guilty of a gross misdemeanor
 33 punishable only by a fine of five hundred twenty-nine dollars.

34 (d) The department may adopt rules necessary to implement this 35 subsection, including rules under which a natural person applying for 36 registration may be exempt from the requirements of this subsection 37 where the person provides evidence satisfactory to the department that 1 he or she has a valid and compelling reason for not being able to meet

2 the requirements of this subsection.

3 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.63.020 and 2004 c 95 s 14 are each amended to read 4 as follows:
