AN ACT Relating to citizen advisory committees for toll charge oversight; amending RCW 47.46.090; and adding a new section to chapter 47.46 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.46.090 and 2002 c 114 s 6 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) A citizen advisory committee must be created for any project 8 developed under this chapter that imposes toll charges for use of a 9 transportation facility. The governor shall appoint nine members to 10 the committee, all of whom must be permanent residents of the affected 11 project area((, as that term is used in RCW 47.46.030)) as defined for 12 each project. Members of the committee shall serve without 13 compensation.

14 (2) The citizen advisory committee shall serve in an advisory 15 capacity to the commission on all matters related to the imposition of 16 tolls((. Members of the committee shall serve without compensation)) 17 including, but not limited to, (a) the feasibility of providing 18 discounts to frequent users, electronic transponder users, senior citizens, or students; (b) the tradeoff of lower tolls versus the early retirement of debt; and (c) a consideration of variable, or time of day pricing.

4 (3) No toll charge may be imposed or modified unless the citizen 5 advisory committee has been given at least twenty days to review and 6 comment on any proposed toll charge schedule. In setting toll rates, 7 the commission shall give consideration to any recommendations of the 8 citizen advisory committee.

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 47.46 RCW 10 to read as follows:

11 The Tacoma Narrows bridge citizen advisory committee is hereby 12 created as directed under RCW 47.46.090. The advisory committee 13 members shall be appointed proportionately, to the extent practicable, 14 from those areas from which the majority of the trips originate on the 15 bridge according to the latest traffic analysis by the department. 16 Passed by the House April 18, 2005.
