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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 42.56.300 and 2005 c 274 s 410 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
 - (1) Records, maps, or other information identifying the location of archaeological sites in order to avoid the looting or depredation of such sites are exempt from disclosure under this chapter.
- (2) Records, maps, and other information, acquired during watershed
- analysis pursuant to the forests and fish report under RCW 76.09.370,
- 12 that identify the location of archaeological sites, historic sites,
- 13 artifacts, or the sites of traditional religious, ceremonial, or social
- 14 uses and activities of affected Indian tribes, are exempt from
- 15 <u>disclosure under this chapter in order to prevent the looting or</u>
- 16 depredation of such sites.
