3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 18.73.250 and 2001 c 24 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) All of the state's ambulance and aid services shall make 7 epinephrine available to their emergency medical technicians in their 8 emergency care supplies. The emergency medical technician may 9 administer epinephrine ((to a patient of any age upon the presentation 10 of evidence of a prescription for epinephrine or to a patient under 11 eighteen years of age:

12 (a) Upon the request of the patient or his or her parent or 13 guardian; or

14 (b) Upon the request of a person who presents written authorization 15 from the patient or his or her parent or guardian making such a 16 request)).

(2) ((Any emergency medical technician, emergency medical service,
or medical program director acting in good faith and in compliance with

- 1 the provisions of this section shall not be liable for any civil
- 2 damages arising out of the furnishing or administration of epinephrine.

- 4 epinephrine by a first responder.
