

**SHB 1128** - S AMD to WM COMM AMD (S-3134.3) **341**

**NOT ADOPTED 3/31/2007**

1 On page 226, after line 10, insert the following:

2 **"NEW SECTION. Sec. 728. AGENCY EXPENDITURES FOR PURCHASED**  
3 **SERVICES.** The office of financial management shall reduce allotments  
4 for all agencies for personal service contracts, equipment, and travel  
5 by \$20,000,000 from general fund--state appropriations in this act to  
6 reflect savings resulting from implementation of the authority of state  
7 agencies to purchase services by contract under RCW 41.06.142. The  
8 general fund allotment reduction shall be placed in unallotted status  
9 and remain unexpended."

10 On page 19, line 4, increase the general fund--state appropriation  
11 (FY 2008) by \$10,000,000

12 On page 19, line 5, increase the general fund--state appropriation  
13 (FY 2009) by \$10,000,000

14 Correct the total accordingly.

15 On page 27, after line 19, insert the following:

16 "(37) \$10,000,000 of the general fund--state appropriation for  
17 fiscal year 2008 and \$10,000,000 of the general fund--state  
18 appropriation for fiscal year 2009 are provided solely for grants to  
19 local governments for jail capacity expansion projects. These may  
20 include modifications and improvements to existing facilities that  
21 result in licensing capacity as well as design and construction of new  
22 facilities. Grants provided in this section shall be limited to up to  
23 one million per jurisdiction. The department of corrections, in  
24 consultation with the Washington association of sheriffs and police  
25 chiefs, shall develop criteria for allocating moneys appropriated in  
26 this section to local governments."

27 Renumber the sections consecutively and correct any internal  
28 references accordingly.

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**EFFECT:** Recognizes \$20 million savings resulting from implementation of the "contracting out" provisions of the Personnel System Reform Act. Appropriates \$20 million to CTED to distribute as grants to local governments to add capacity to local jails. The Department of Corrections, in consultation with the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs, will develop criteria for allocating the funds to local governments.
