State of Washington 60th Legislature 2007 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to outdoor education and recreation; adding a new 2 section to chapter 79A.05 RCW; and creating a new section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature to 4 5 establish an outdoor education and recreation program to improve students' performance on the essential academic learning requirements 6 7 for science through participation in outdoor educational and 8 recreational opportunities. Further, it is the intent of the program to recognize the resulting benefit of improved student health through 9 10 involvement in outdoor recreation.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 79A.05 RCW 12 to read as follows:

(1) The outdoor education and recreation grant program is hereby created, subject to the availability of funds in the outdoor education and recreation account. The commission shall establish and implement the program by rule to provide opportunities for public agencies and private organizations and individuals to participate in the outdoor education and recreation program. Eligible applicants to the commission's grant program shall include existing and new programs.
Participating school programs shall be fully aligned with the state's
essential academic learning requirements for science.

4 (2) The program shall be phased in beginning with the schools and 5 students with the greatest needs in suburban, rural, and urban areas of 6 the state. The program shall focus on students who qualify for free 7 and reduced-price lunch, who are most likely to fail academically, or 8 who have the greatest potential to drop out of school.

9 (3) The director shall set priorities and develop criteria for the 10 awarding of grants to outdoor education and recreation programs 11 considering at least the following:

12 (a) Programs that contribute to the reduction of academic failure13 and dropout rates;

14 (b) Programs that make use of nationally accredited environmental 15 education curriculum;

16 (c) Programs that contribute to healthy life styles through outdoor 17 recreation and sound nutrition;

18 (d) Various Washington state parks as venues and use of the 19 commission's personnel as a resource;

20 (e) Programs that maximize the number of participants that can be 21 served;

22 (f) Programs that will commit matching and in-kind resources; and

23 (g) Programs that create partnerships with public and private 24 entities.

25 (4) The director shall create an advisory committee to assist and advise the commission in the development and administration of the 26 27 outdoor education and recreation program. The director should solicit representation on the committee from the office of the superintendent 28 of public instruction, the department of fish and wildlife, the 29 business community, outdoor organizations with an interest 30 in education, and any others the commission deems sufficient to ensure a 31 32 cross section of stakeholders. When the director creates such an advisory committee, its members shall be reimbursed from the outdoor 33 education and recreation program account for travel expenses as 34 provided in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060. 35

(5) The outdoor education and recreation program account is created
in the custody of the state treasurer. Funds deposited in the outdoor
education and recreation program account shall be transferred only to

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the commission to be used solely for the commission's outdoor education 1 2 and recreation program purposes identified in this section including the administration of the program. The director may accept gifts, 3 grants, donations, or moneys from any source for deposit in the outdoor 4 education and recreation program account. Any public agency in this 5 state may develop and implement outdoor education and recreation 6 7 programs. The director may make grants to public agencies and contract with any public or private agency or person to develop and implement 8 outdoor education and recreation programs. The outdoor education and 9 10 recreation program account is subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for 11 12 expenditures.

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
