1 AN ACT Relating to small works roster contracting procedures; and 2 amending RCW 39.04.155.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 39.04.155 and 2001 c 284 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

(1) This section provides uniform small works roster provisions to 6 7 award contracts for construction, building, renovation, remodeling, 8 alteration, repair, or improvement of real property that may be used by state agencies and by any local government that is expressly authorized 9 10 to use these provisions. These provisions may be used in lieu of other procedures to award contracts for such work with an estimated cost of 11 two hundred thousand dollars or less. The small works roster process 12 includes the limited public works process authorized under subsection 13 (3) of this section and any local government authorized to award 14 contracts using the small works roster process under this section may 15 award contracts using the limited public works process under subsection 16 (3) of this section. 17

18 (2)(a) A state agency or authorized local government may create a 19 single general small works roster, or may create a small works roster

for different specialties or categories of anticipated work. 1 Where 2 applicable, small works rosters may make distinctions between contractors based upon different geographic areas served by the 3 contractor. The small works roster or rosters shall consist of all 4 responsible contractors who have requested to be on the list, and where 5 required by law are properly licensed or registered to perform such 6 7 work in this state. A state agency or local government establishing a small works roster or rosters may require eligible contractors desiring 8 to be placed on a roster or rosters to keep current records of any 9 10 applicable licenses, certifications, registrations, bonding, insurance, or other appropriate matters on file with the state agency or local 11 12 government as a condition of being placed on a roster or rosters. At 13 least once a year, the state agency or local government shall publish in a newspaper of general circulation within the jurisdiction a notice 14 15 of the existence of the roster or rosters and solicit the names of contractors for such roster or rosters. In addition, responsible 16 contractors shall be added to an appropriate roster or rosters at any 17 time they submit a written request and necessary records. 18 Master contracts may be required to be signed that become effective when a 19 specific award is made using a small works roster. 20

21 (b) A state agency establishing a small works roster or rosters 22 shall adopt rules implementing this subsection. A local government establishing a small works roster or rosters shall adopt an ordinance 23 24 or resolution implementing this subsection. Procedures included in 25 rules adopted by the department of general administration in 26 implementing this subsection must be included in any rules providing 27 for a small works roster or rosters that is adopted by another state agency, if the authority for that state agency to engage in these 28 activities has been delegated to it by the department of general 29 30 administration under chapter 43.19 RCW. An interlocal contract or agreement between two or more state agencies or local governments 31 32 establishing a small works roster or rosters to be used by the parties to the agreement or contract must clearly identify the lead entity that 33 is responsible for implementing the provisions of this subsection. 34

35 (c) Procedures shall be established for securing telephone, 36 written, or electronic quotations from contractors on the appropriate 37 small works roster to assure that a competitive price is established 38 and to award contracts to the lowest responsible bidder, as defined in

RCW 43.19.1911. Invitations for quotations shall include an estimate 1 2 of the scope and nature of the work to be performed as well as materials and equipment to be furnished. However, detailed plans and 3 specifications need not be included in the invitation. This subsection 4 5 does not eliminate other requirements for architectural or engineering approvals as to quality and compliance with building codes. Quotations б may be invited from all appropriate contractors on the appropriate 7 small works roster. As an alternative, quotations may be invited from 8 9 at least five contractors on the appropriate small works roster who 10 have indicated the capability of performing the kind of work being contracted, in a manner that will equitably distribute the opportunity 11 12 among the contractors on the appropriate roster. However, if the estimated cost of the work is from one hundred thousand dollars to two 13 14 hundred thousand dollars, a state agency or local government, other than a port district, that chooses to solicit bids from less than all 15 16 the appropriate contractors on the appropriate small works roster must 17 also notify the remaining contractors on the appropriate small works roster that quotations on the work are being sought. The government 18 has the sole option of determining whether this notice to the remaining 19 contractors is made by: (i) Publishing notice in a legal newspaper in 20 21 general circulation in the area where the work is to be done; (ii) 22 mailing a notice to these contractors; or (iii) sending a notice to these contractors by facsimile or other electronic means. For purposes 23 24 of this subsection (2)(c), "equitably distribute" means that a state 25 agency or local government soliciting bids may not favor certain contractors on the appropriate small works roster over other 26 27 contractors on the appropriate small works roster who perform similar services. 28

(d) A contract awarded from a small works roster under this sectionneed not be advertised.

31 (e) Immediately after an award is made, the bid quotations obtained 32 shall be recorded, open to public inspection, and available by 33 telephone inquiry.

(3) In lieu of awarding contracts under subsection (2) of this
section, a state agency or authorized local government may award a
contract for work, construction, alteration, repair, or improvement
((project [projects])) projects estimated to cost less than thirty-five
thousand dollars using the limited public works process provided under

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this subsection. Public works projects awarded under this subsection are exempt from the other requirements of the small works roster process provided under subsection (2) of this section and are exempt from the requirement that contracts be awarded after advertisement as provided under RCW 39.04.010.

For limited public works projects, a state agency or authorized 6 7 local government shall solicit electronic or written guotations from a minimum of three contractors from the appropriate small works roster 8 and shall award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder as 9 10 defined under RCW 43.19.1911. After an award is made, the quotations shall be open to public inspection and available by electronic request. 11 A state agency or authorized local government shall attempt to 12 13 distribute opportunities for limited public works projects equitably 14 among contractors willing to perform in the geographic area of the work. A state agency or authorized local government shall maintain a 15 16 list of the contractors contacted and the contracts awarded during the 17 previous twenty-four months under the limited public works process, including the name of the contractor, the contractor's registration 18 number, the amount of the contract, a brief description of the type of 19 work performed, and the date the contract was awarded. For limited 20 21 public works projects, a state agency or authorized local government 22 may waive the payment and performance bond requirements of chapter 39.08 RCW and the retainage requirements of chapter 60.28 RCW, thereby 23 24 assuming the liability for the contractor's nonpayment of laborers, 25 mechanics, subcontractors, ((materialmen)) materialpersons, suppliers, and taxes imposed under Title 82 RCW that may be due from the 26 27 contractor for the limited public works project, however the state agency or authorized local government shall have the right of recovery 28 against the contractor for any payments made on the contractor's 29 30 behalf.

(4) The breaking of any project into units or accomplishing any projects by phases is prohibited if it is done for the purpose of avoiding the maximum dollar amount of a contract that may be let using the small works roster process or limited public works process.

35 (5) <u>A state agency or authorized local government may adopt</u> 36 procedures to award small works roster contracts to small businesses 37 with gross revenues under one million dollars annually as reported on 38 their federal tax return. Additional procedures may be developed to

award small works roster contracts to small businesses with gross 1 2 revenues under two hundred fifty thousand dollars annually as reported on their federal tax return. For contracts awarded to small businesses 3 with gross revenues under two hundred fifty thousand dollars annually, 4 a state agency or authorized local government may waive the payment and 5 б performance bond requirements of chapter 39.08 RCW and the retainage requirements of chapter 60.28 RCW, and assume the liability for the 7 contractor's nonpayment of laborers, mechanics, subcontractors, 8 materialpersons, suppliers, and taxes imposed under Title 82 RCW. If 9 the state agency or authorized local government assumes this liability, 10 11 it has the right of recovery against the contractor for any payments 12 made on behalf of the contractor.

13 (6) As used in this section, "state agency" means the department of 14 general administration, the state parks and recreation commission, the 15 department of natural resources, the department of fish and wildlife, the department of transportation, any institution of higher education 16 17 as defined under RCW 28B.10.016, and any other state agency delegated authority by the department of general administration to engage in 18 19 construction, building, renovation, remodeling, alteration, improvement, or repair activities. 20

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
