1 AN ACT Relating to compliance with federal selective service 2 requirements before the issuance of drivers' licenses and identicards; 3 adding a new section to chapter 46.20 RCW; and providing an effective 4 date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 46.20 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 (1) Any person who is a male citizen or noncitizen of the United 9 States, who applies for an original, the renewal of, or a replacement 10 instruction permit, intermediate license, driver's license, or 11 identicard under this chapter, and who is under the age of twenty-six, 12 must be registered as required by the military selective service act 13 (62 Stat. 604, 50 App. U.S.C. Sec. 451 et seq.), as amended.

14 (2) The submission of an application by an applicant under 15 subsection (1) of this section indicates that (a) the applicant has 16 already registered with the selective service system or (b) the 17 applicant authorizes the department to forward to the selective service 18 system the necessary personal information required for registration 19 into the system. The department shall forward electronically any

necessary personal information of the applicant to the selective 1 service system within ten days of receipt of the application, as 2 authorized under (b) of this subsection. When applicable, the 3 department shall notify the applicant at the time of application 4 submission that, by submitting the application, the applicant 5 authorizes the department to register the applicant with the selective 6 7 service system. If the applicant is under the age of eighteen at the time of application, the department shall notify the applicant that he 8 will be registered with the selective service system as required by 9 10 federal law.

11 (3) The department may adopt rules as necessary to implement this 12 section.

13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act takes effect January 1, 2008.

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
