1 AN ACT Relating to cost recovery for fire protection and public 2 safety services rendered on navigable waters of the state to commercial 3 vessels by fire protection agencies; and adding a new section to 4 chapter 35.21 RCW.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 35.21 RCW 7 to read as follows:

(1) When a fire or public safety incident involving a commercial 8 vessel occurs on navigable waters of the state, within or outside of 9 10 the territorial limits of any fire protection district as established by chapter 52.20 RCW, a city or town as defined by RCW 35.103.020, or 11 a regional fire service authority as established by chapter 52.26 RCW, 12 13 and marine rescue and firefighting services are provided, with or without a contract to do so, the responding fire protection agency may 14 15 recover from the person or vessel receiving the marine rescue and 16 firefighting services the following:

17 (a) The contract or reasonable value of the use, including repairs18 and depreciation, of the apparatus and equipment used;

1 (b) The cost of fire protection personnel engaged to provide marine 2 rescue and firefighting services as a result of the fire or public 3 safety incident; and

4 (c) All other costs reasonably incurred in providing the marine 5 rescue and firefighting services as a result of the fire or public 6 safety incident.

7 (2) As used in this section "navigable waters of the state" has the
8 same meaning as in RCW 88.46.010(11).

9 (3) As used in this section "commercial vessel" means a "covered 10 vessel" as defined in RCW 88.46.010(5).

11 (4) This section does not preempt or limit the cost recovery rights 12 and remedies available to a fire protection agency by other state or 13 federal law.
