## SENATE BILL 6743

State of Washington 60th Legislature 2008 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to autism awareness instruction for teachers of 1 2 students with autism; and adding a new section to chapter 28A.155 RCW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 3

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28A.155 RCW to read as follows:

(1) The professional educator standards board, in consultation with 6 7 the office of the superintendent of public instruction, the autism task 8 force, and representatives from state and nonprofit agencies that promote autism awareness and provide programs and services for people 9 10 with autism, shall develop autism awareness and training policy 11 guidelines for schools to ensure that teachers responsible for autistic 12 children are well-prepared and up-to-date on the most effective methods of teaching children with autism. 13

14 (2) The autism awareness and training policy guidelines shall 15 ensure, but need not be limited to requiring that:

16 (a) A candidate for a Washington instructional certificate satisfactorily complete instruction in autism awareness and methods of 17 teaching students with autism at an accredited institution of higher 18 education; 19

1 (b) A person seeking certification through an alternate route, 2 within one year of being employed, satisfactorily complete instruction 3 in autism awareness and methods for teaching students with autism at an 4 accredited institution of higher education; and

5 (c) All teachers not subject to (a) or (b) of this subsection be 6 required to pursue instruction in autism awareness and methods for 7 teaching students with autism by the 2010-11 school year as part of the 8 professional development requirement established by the professional 9 educator standards board.

(3) By September 1, 2008, the professional educator standards board 10 shall develop recommendations for autism awareness instruction and 11 12 methods of teaching students with autism for all teacher preparation 13 professional development programs and shall and submit the 14 recommendations to the governor and the education committees of the 15 legislature.

(4) By December 1, 2008, the superintendent of public instruction
shall report the policy guidelines to school districts for the
districts to use to develop and adopt their policies.

19 (5) By April 1, 2009, each school district shall use the guidelines 20 developed under subsection (1) of this section to develop and adopt a 21 school district policy for each school in the district to ensure that 22 teachers are well-prepared and up-to-date on the most effective methods 23 of teaching children with autism.

(6) Guidelines adopted by school districts under this section shall
 also apply to classified staff seeking a special education endorsement
 or certification, or both.

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
