AN ACT Relating to the designation of the thirteenth day of January of each year as Korean-American day; amending RCW 1.16.050 and 3 43.117.070; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that in the more than one hundred years that Koreans have immigrated to the United States, 6 immigrants and their descendants have made an 7 these invaluable 8 contribution to our state and nation. Korean-Americans have worked for many years to better not only their community, but the communities in 9 10 which they live and the state as a whole. The legislature further finds that due to the close friendship between the people of Korea and 11 12 the United States, it is fitting to recognize Korean-American contributions to our society in a dignified and fitting manner, and to 13 14 encourage Korean-Americans to honor the sacrifices made by American citizens during the Korean War. 15

16 Sec. 2. RCW 1.16.050 and 2003 c 68 s 2 are each amended to read as
17 follows:

18 The following are legal holidays: Sunday; the first day of

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January, commonly called New Year's Day; the third Monday of January, 1 2 being celebrated as the anniversary of the birth of Martin Luther King, Jr.; the third Monday of February to be known as Presidents' Day and to 3 be celebrated as the anniversary of the births of Abraham Lincoln and 4 5 George Washington; the last Monday of May, commonly known as Memorial Day; the fourth day of July, being the anniversary of the Declaration 6 7 of Independence; the first Monday in September, to be known as Labor Day; the eleventh day of November, to be known as Veterans' Day; the 8 fourth Thursday in November, to be known as Thanksgiving Day; the day 9 immediately following Thanksgiving Day; and the twenty-fifth day of 10 December, commonly called Christmas Day. 11

Employees of the state and its political subdivisions, except 12 13 employees of school districts and except those nonclassified employees 14 of institutions of higher education who hold appointments or are employed under contracts to perform services for periods of less than 15 twelve consecutive months, shall be entitled to one paid holiday per 16 17 calendar year in addition to those specified in this section. Each employee of the state or its political subdivisions may select the day 18 on which the employee desires to take the additional holiday provided 19 for herein after consultation with the employer pursuant to guidelines 20 21 to be promulgated by rule of the appropriate personnel authority, or in 22 the case of local government by ordinance or resolution of the 23 legislative authority.

If any of the above specified state legal holidays are also federal legal holidays but observed on different dates, only the state legal holidays shall be recognized as a paid legal holiday for employees of the state and its political subdivisions except that for port districts and the law enforcement and public transit employees of municipal corporations, either the federal or the state legal holiday, but in no case both, may be recognized as a paid legal holiday for employees.

31 Whenever any legal holiday, other than Sunday, falls upon a Sunday, 32 the following Monday shall be the legal holiday.

33 Whenever any legal holiday falls upon a Saturday, the preceding 34 Friday shall be the legal holiday.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to have the effect of adding or deleting the number of paid holidays provided for in an agreement between employees and employers of political subdivisions of the state or as established by ordinance or resolution of the local
 government legislative authority.

3 The legislature declares that the thirteenth day of January shall
4 be recognized as Korean-American Day but shall not be considered a
5 legal holiday for any purposes.

6 The legislature declares that the twelfth day of October shall be 7 recognized as Columbus Day but shall not be considered a legal holiday 8 for any purposes.

9 The legislature declares that the ninth day of April shall be 10 recognized as former prisoner of war recognition day but shall not be 11 considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

12 The legislature declares that the twenty-sixth day of January shall 13 be recognized as Washington army and air national guard day but shall 14 not be considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

The legislature declares that the seventh day of August shall be recognized as purple heart recipient recognition day but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

18 The legislature declares that the second Sunday in October be 19 recognized as Washington state children's day but shall not be 20 considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

The legislature declares that the sixteenth day of April shall be recognized as Mother Joseph day and the fourth day of September as Marcus Whitman day, but neither shall be considered legal holidays for any purpose.

The legislature declares that the seventh day of December be recognized as Pearl Harbor remembrance day but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purpose.

The legislature declares that the nineteenth day of February be recognized as civil liberties day of remembrance but shall not be considered a legal holiday for any purpose.

31 **Sec. 3.** RCW 43.117.070 and 2000 c 236 s 3 are each amended to read 32 as follows:

(1) The commission shall examine and define issues pertaining to 33 needs of Asian Pacific Americans, 34 the rights and and make recommendations to the governor and state agencies with respect to 35 36 desirable changes in program and law.

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1 (2) The commission shall advise such state government agencies on 2 the development and implementation of comprehensive and coordinated 3 policies, plans, and programs focusing on the special problems and 4 needs of Asian Pacific Americans.

5 (3) The commission shall coordinate and assist with statewide 6 celebrations during the fourth week of Asian Pacific American Heritage 7 Month that recognize the contributions to the state by Asian Pacific 8 Americans in the arts, sciences, commerce, and education.

9 (4) <u>The commission shall coordinate and assist educational</u> 10 <u>institutions, public entities, and private organizations with</u> 11 <u>celebrations of Korean-American day that recognize the contributions to</u> 12 <u>the state by Korean-Americans in the arts, sciences, commerce, and</u> 13 <u>education.</u>

14 (5) Each state department and agency shall provide appropriate and 15 reasonable assistance to the commission as needed in order that the 16 commission may carry out the purposes of this chapter.

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
