AN ACT Relating to administrative practices concerning the information processing and communications systems of the legislature overseen by the joint legislative systems committee; amending RCW 4.68.010, 44.68.030, 44.68.040, 44.68.050, and 44.68.060; adding new sections to chapter 44.68 RCW; creating a new section; repealing RCW 44.68.070; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

8 Sec. 1. RCW 44.68.010 and 1986 c 61 s 1 are each amended to read 9 as follows:

10 Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitions in 11 this section apply throughout this chapter.

(1) "Administrative committee" means the joint legislative systems
 administrative committee created under RCW 44.68.030.

14 (2) "Center" means the ((joint)) legislative service center 15 established under RCW 44.68.060.

16 (3) "Coordinator" means the legislative systems coordinator 17 employed under RCW 44.68.040.

18 (4) "Systems committee" means the joint legislative systems19 committee created under RCW 44.68.020.

1 Sec. 2. RCW 44.68.030 and 1986 c 61 s 3 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

3 (1) The joint legislative systems administrative committee is 4 created to manage the information processing and communications systems 5 of the legislature. The administrative committee consists of five 6 members appointed as follows:

7 (a) The secretary of the senate, and another senate staff person
8 appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the secretary;

9 (b) The chief clerk of the house of representatives, and another 10 house of representatives staff person appointed by and serving at the 11 pleasure of the chief clerk; and

12 (c) The code reviser, or the code reviser's designee, serving in a 13 nonvoting capacity.

14 (2) The coordinator shall serve as the secretary of the 15 administrative committee.

16 **Sec. 3.** RCW 44.68.040 and 2001 c 259 s 17 are each amended to read 17 as follows:

18 Subject to RCW 44.04.260:

19 (1) The systems committee, after consultation with the 20 administrative committee, shall employ a legislative systems 21 coordinator. The coordinator shall serve at the pleasure of the 22 systems committee, which shall fix the coordinator's salary.

23 (2)(a) The coordinator shall serve the executive and as administrative head of the center, and shall assist the administrative 24 committee in managing the information processing and communications 25 26 systems of the legislature as directed by the administrative committee: (b) In accordance with an adopted personnel plan, the coordinator 27 shall employ or engage and fix the compensation for personnel required 28 to carry out the purposes of this chapter; 29

30 (c) The coordinator shall enter into contracts for: (i) The sale, 31 exchange, or acquisition of equipment, supplies, services, and 32 facilities required to carry out the purposes of this chapter; and (ii) 33 the distribution of legislative information.

34 Sec. 4. RCW 44.68.050 and 2001 c 259 s 18 are each amended to read 35 as follows:

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1 The administrative committee shall, subject to the approval of the 2 systems committee and subject to RCW 44.04.260:

3 (1) Adopt policies, procedures, and standards regarding the
4 information processing and communications systems of the legislature;

5 (2) Establish appropriate charges for services, equipment, and 6 publications provided by the legislative information processing and 7 communications systems, applicable to legislative and nonlegislative 8 users as determined by the administrative committee;

9 (3) ((Employ or engage and fix the)) Adopt a compensation plan for 10 personnel required to carry out the purposes of this chapter;

(4) ((Enter into contracts for (a) the sale, exchange, or acquisition of equipment, supplies, services, and facilities)) Approve strategic and tactical information technology plans and provide quidance in operational matters required to carry out (a) the purposes of this chapter; and (b) the distribution of legislative information;

16 (5) Generally assist the systems committee in carrying out its 17 responsibilities under this chapter, as directed by the systems 18 committee.

19 Sec. 5. RCW 44.68.060 and 1986 c 61 s 6 are each amended to read 20 as follows:

21 (1) The administrative committee, subject to the approval of the systems committee, shall establish a ((joint)) legislative service 22 23 center. The center shall provide automatic data processing services, 24 equipment, training, and support to the legislature and legislative agencies. The center may also, by agreement, provide services to 25 26 agencies of the judicial and executive branches of state government and other governmental entities, and provide public access to legislative 27 information. All operations of the center shall be subject to the 28 general supervision of the administrative committee in accordance with 29 30 the policies, procedures, and standards established under RCW 44.68.050. 31

32 (2) Except as provided otherwise in subsection (3) of this section, 33 determinations regarding the security, disclosure, and disposition of 34 information placed or maintained in the center shall rest solely with 35 the originator and shall be made in accordance with any law regulating 36 the disclosure of such information. The originator is the person who 37 directly places information in the center.

(3) When utilizing the center to carry out the bill drafting 1 2 functions required under RCW 1.08.027, the code reviser shall be considered the originator as defined in RCW 44.68.060. 3 However, determinations regarding the security, disclosure, and disposition of 4 drafts placed or maintained in the center shall be made by the person 5 requesting the code reviser's services and the code reviser, acting as 6 7 the originator, shall comply with and carry out such determinations as directed by that person. A measure once introduced shall not be 8 considered a draft under this subsection. 9

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 44.68 RCW 11 to read as follows:

12 Subject to RCW 44.04.260, all expenses incurred, including salaries and expenses of employees, shall be paid upon voucher forms as provided 13 and signed by the coordinator. Vouchers may be drawn on funds 14 15 appropriated by law for the systems committee, administrative 16 committee, and center: PROVIDED, That the senate, house of 17 representatives, and code reviser may authorize the systems committee, administrative committee, and center to draw on funds appropriated by 18 the legislature for related information technology expenses. 19 The 20 senate and house of representatives may transfer moneys appropriated 21 for legislative expenses to the systems committee, administrative committee, and center, in addition to charges made under RCW 22 23 44.68.050(2).

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 44.68 RCW 25 to read as follows:

The systems committee, administrative committee, and center are hereby expressly exempted from the provisions of chapter 43.105 RCW.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. The legislative systems revolving fund is abolished as of July 1, 2007. All moneys remaining in the legislative systems revolving fund on July 1, 2007, shall be transferred to the state general fund.

32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 9. RCW 44.68.070 (Legislative systems revolving 33 fund) and 1986 c 61 s 7 are each repealed.

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 2007.

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
