AN ACT Relating to death benefits for public employees; and
 amending RCW 41.04.017, 41.26.048, 41.32.053, 41.35.115, 41.37.110,
 41.40.0931, 41.40.0932, 41.40.700, and 43.43.285.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 41.04.017 and 2003 c 402 s 4 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid as 8 a sundry claim to the estate of an employee of any state agency, the common school system of the state, or institution of higher education 9 who dies as a result of (1) injuries sustained in the course of 10 employment; or (2) an occupational disease or infection that arises 11 naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter, 12 13 and is not otherwise provided a death benefit through coverage under their enrolled retirement system under chapter 402, Laws of 2003. 14 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made consistent 15 with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries. 16 The 17 department of labor and industries shall notify the director of the department of general administration by order under RCW 51.52.050. 18

1 Sec. 2. RCW 41.26.048 and 2006 c 351 s 1 are each amended to read
2 as follows:

(1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid 3 estate, or such person or persons, trust 4 to the member's or organization as the member shall have nominated by written designation 5 duly executed and filed with the department. If there be no such 6 7 designated person or persons still living at the time of the member's death, such member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's 8 surviving spouse as if in fact such spouse had been nominated by 9 10 written designation, or if there be no such surviving spouse, then to such member's legal representatives. 11

12 (2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only when death 13 occurs: (a) As a result of injuries sustained in the course of 14 employment; or (b) ((to a member of plan 2)) as a result of an occupational disease or infection that arises naturally and proximately 15 out of employment covered under this chapter. 16 The determination of 17 eligibility for the benefit shall be made consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries. The department of labor and 18 industries shall notify the department of retirement systems by order 19 under RCW 51.52.050. 20

21 **Sec. 3.** RCW 41.32.053 and 2003 c 402 s 2 are each amended to read 22 as follows:

23 (1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid 24 to the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust or organization as the member has nominated by written designation duly 25 26 executed and filed with the department. If no such designated person 27 or persons are still living at the time of the member's death, the member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse 28 29 as if in fact the spouse had been nominated by written designation, or 30 if there is no surviving spouse, then to the member's legal 31 representatives.

(2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death
occurs as a result of (a) injuries sustained in the course of
employment; or (b) an occupational disease or infection that arises
naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter.
The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made

consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries.
 The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of
 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.

4 **Sec. 4.** RCW 41.35.115 and 2003 c 402 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid 7 the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust to or organization as the member has nominated by written designation duly 8 9 executed and filed with the department. If no such designated person or persons are still living at the time of the member's death, the 10 11 member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse as if in fact the spouse had been nominated by written designation, or 12 if there is no surviving spouse, then to the member's legal 13 14 representatives.

(2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death 15 16 occurs as a result of (a) injuries sustained in the course of 17 employment; or (b) an occupational disease or infection that arises naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter. 18 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made 19 20 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries. 21 The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of 22 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.

23 **Sec. 5.** RCW 41.37.110 and 2004 c 242 s 14 are each amended to read 24 as follows:

25 (1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid the member's estate, or the person or persons, trust, or 26 to organization the member has nominated by written designation duly 27 executed and filed with the department. If the designated person or 28 29 persons are not still living at the time of the member's death, the 30 member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse 31 as if in fact the spouse had been nominated by written designation, or 32 if there is no surviving spouse, then to the member's legal representatives. 33

34 (2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death
 35 occurs as a result of (a) injuries sustained in the course of
 36 employment; or (b) an occupational disease or infection that arises

<u>naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter</u>.
 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made
 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries.
 The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of
 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.

6 **Sec. 6.** RCW 41.40.0931 and 1998 c 157 s 1 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

(1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit for members 8 who had the opportunity to transfer to the law enforcement officers' 9 and fire fighters' retirement system pursuant to chapter 502, Laws of 10 11 1993, but elected to remain in the public employees' retirement system, shall be paid to the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust, 12 or organization as the member has nominated by written designation duly 13 executed and filed with the department. If there is no designated 14 15 person or persons still living at the time of the member's death, the 16 member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse as if in fact the spouse had been nominated by written designation, or 17 18 if there is no surviving spouse, then to the member's legal 19 representatives.

20 (2) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, the benefit under 21 this section shall be paid only where death occurs as a result of (a) 22 injuries sustained in the course of employment as a general authority police officer; or (b) an occupational disease or infection that arises 23 naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter. 24 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made 25 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries. 26 The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of 27 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050. 28

(3) The benefit under this section shall not be paid in the event the member was in the act of committing a felony when the fatal injuries were suffered.

32 Sec. 7. RCW 41.40.0932 and 2003 c 402 s 1 are each amended to read 33 as follows:

34 (1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid 35 to the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust or 36 organization as the member has nominated by written designation duly

executed and filed with the department. If no such designated person or persons are still living at the time of the member's death, the member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse as if in fact the spouse had been nominated by written designation, or if there is no surviving spouse, then to the member's legal representatives.

7 (2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death occurs as a result of (a) injuries sustained in the course of 8 employment; or (b) an occupational disease or infection that arises 9 naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter. 10 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made 11 12 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries. The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of 13 14 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.

15 Sec. 8. RCW 41.40.700 and 2003 c 155 s 7 are each amended to read 16 as follows:

(1) Except as provided in RCW 11.07.010, if a member or a vested 17 member who has not completed at least ten years of service dies, the 18 amount of the accumulated contributions standing to such member's 19 20 credit in the retirement system at the time of such member's death, 21 less any amount identified as owing to an obligee upon withdrawal of accumulated contributions pursuant to a court order filed under RCW 22 23 41.50.670, shall be paid to the member's estate, or such person or 24 persons, trust, or organization as the member shall have nominated by 25 written designation duly executed and filed with the department. If 26 there be no such designated person or persons still living at the time of the member's death, such member's accumulated contributions standing 27 to such member's credit in the retirement system, less any amount 28 identified as owing to an obligee upon withdrawal of accumulated 29 contributions pursuant to a court order filed under RCW 41.50.670, 30 31 shall be paid to the member's surviving spouse as if in fact such spouse had been nominated by written designation, or if there be no 32 33 such surviving spouse, then to such member's legal representatives.

34 (2) If a member who is eligible for retirement or a member who has 35 completed at least ten years of service dies, the surviving spouse or 36 eligible child or children shall elect to receive ((either)) one of the 37 following:

(a) A retirement allowance computed as provided for in RCW 1 2 41.40.630, actuarially reduced by the amount of any lump sum benefit identified as owing to an obligee upon withdrawal of accumulated 3 contributions pursuant to a court order filed under RCW 41.50.670 and 4 actuarially adjusted to reflect a joint and one hundred percent 5 survivor option under RCW 41.40.660 and, except under subsection (4) of 6 7 this section, if the member was not eligible for normal retirement at the date of death a further reduction as described in RCW 41.40.630; if 8 a surviving spouse who is receiving a retirement allowance dies leaving 9 10 a child or children of the member under the age of majority, then such child or children shall continue to receive an allowance in an amount 11 equal to that which was being received by the surviving spouse, share 12 13 and share alike, until such child or children reach the age of majority; if there is no surviving spouse eligible to receive an 14 allowance at the time of the member's death, such member's child or 15 children under the age of majority shall receive an allowance share and 16 17 share alike calculated as herein provided making the assumption that the ages of the spouse and member were equal at the time of the 18 member's death; ((or)) 19

20 (b) The member's accumulated contributions, less any amount 21 identified as owing to an obligee upon withdrawal of accumulated 22 contributions pursuant to a court order filed under RCW 41.50.670; or

(c) For a member who leaves the employ of an employer to enter the 23 24 uniformed services of the United States and who dies after January 1, 2007, while honorably serving in the uniformed services of the United 25 26 States in Operation Enduring Freedom or Persian Gulf, Operation Iraqi 27 Freedom, an amount equal to two hundred percent of the member's accumulated contributions, less any amount identified as owing to an 28 obligee upon withdrawal of accumulated contributions pursuant to a 29 court order filed under RCW 41.50.670. 30

(3) If a member who is eligible for retirement or a member who has completed at least ten years of service dies after October 1, 1977, and is not survived by a spouse or an eligible child, then the accumulated contributions standing to the member's credit, less any amount identified as owing to an obligee upon withdrawal of accumulated contributions pursuant to a court order filed under RCW 41.50.670, shall be paid: (a) To a person or persons, estate, trust, or organization as the
 member shall have nominated by written designation duly executed and
 filed with the department; or

4 (b) If there is no such designated person or persons still living 5 at the time of the member's death, then to the member's legal 6 representatives.

7 (4) A member who is killed in the course of employment, as
8 determined by the director of the department of labor and industries,
9 is not subject to an actuarial reduction under RCW 41.40.630. The
10 member's retirement allowance is computed under RCW 41.40.620.

11 **Sec. 9.** RCW 43.43.285 and 1996 c 226 s 2 are each amended to read 12 as follows:

(1) A one hundred fifty thousand dollar death benefit shall be paid 13 to the member's estate, or such person or persons, trust 14 or organization as the member shall have nominated by written designation 15 16 duly executed and filed with the department. If there be no such 17 designated person or persons still living at the time of the member's death, such member's death benefit shall be paid to the member's 18 19 surviving spouse as if in fact such spouse had been nominated by 20 written designation, or if there be no such surviving spouse, then to 21 such member's legal representatives.

22 (2) The benefit under this section shall be paid only where death 23 occurs as a result of (a) injuries sustained in the course of 24 employment; or (b) an occupational disease or infection that arises naturally and proximately out of employment covered under this chapter. 25 26 The determination of eligibility for the benefit shall be made 27 consistent with Title 51 RCW by the department of labor and industries. The department of labor and industries shall notify the department of 28 29 retirement systems by order under RCW 51.52.050.
