- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 42.17.760 and 1993 c 2 s 16 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- (1) A labor organization may not use agency shop fees paid by an individual who is not a member of the organization to make contributions or expenditures to influence an election or to operate a political committee, unless affirmatively authorized by the individual.
- 10 (2) A labor organization does not use agency shop fees when it uses
- 11 <u>its general treasury funds to make such contributions or expenditures</u>
- 12 <u>if it has sufficient revenues from sources other than agency shop fees</u>
- in its general treasury to fund such contributions or expenditures.
- 14 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate
- 15 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 16 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect

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1 immediately.
