4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 43.70 RCW

5 to read as follows:

The federal government requires Washington health care facilities 6 7 to be certified in order to receive federal health care program 8 reimbursement. The department receives funding from the federal 9 government to perform the certifications and recertifications of these 10 health care facilities. When the federal government does not provide sufficient funding to cover all certifications and recertifications, 11 the secretary may assess fees on certification and recertification 12 13 applicants to fund the certifications and recertifications.
