1 AN ACT Relating to an exemption from unemployment compensation for 2 certain small performing arts industries; and adding a new section to 3 chapter 50.04 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 50.04 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 The term "employment" shall not include services performed by a 8 person who is participating in a performance sponsored by an employer 9 whose North American industry classification system code is within 10 "711110," "711120," "711130," or "712110," so long as the person 11 receives no remuneration other than a nominal stipend and the employer 12 does not have more than three individuals in its employ during any 13 portion of a day during the calendar year.

For purposes of this section, "stipend" means a fixed sum of money paid periodically to defray expenses. The stipend is presumed to defray the person's incidental expenses involved in participating in the performance, including, but not limited to, meals, transportation, 1 lodging, costumes, supplies, and child care.
