1            AN ACT Relating to rates for the rental of county equipment; and  
2 amending RCW 36.33A.040.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 36.33A.040 and 1977 c 67 s 4 are each amended to read  
5 as follows:

6            Rates for the rental of equipment owned by the fund shall be set to  
7 cover all costs of maintenance and repair, material and supplies  
8 consumed in operating or maintaining the equipment, and the future  
9 replacement thereof. The rates shall be determined by the county  
10 engineer or other appointee of the county legislative body and shall be  
11 subject to annual review by the legislative body. This section does  
12 not restrict the ability of the county road administration board to  
13 directly inquire into the process of setting rental rates while  
14 performing its statutory oversight responsibility.
