- MEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 10.58 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 A law enforcement officer, prosecuting attorney, or other
- 7 government official may not ask or require a victim of an alleged sex
- 8 offense to submit to a polygraph examination or other truth telling
- 9 device as a condition for proceeding with the investigation of the
- 10 offense. The refusal of a victim to submit to a polygraph examination
- 11 or other truth telling device shall not by itself prevent the
- 12 investigation, charging, or prosecution of the offense. For the
- 13 purposes of this section, "sex offense" is any offense under chapter
