AN ACT Relating to providing medical coverage for smoking cessation programs; adding a new section to chapter 74.09 RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW 6 to read as follows:

7 The department shall provide coverage under this chapter for 8 smoking cessation counseling services, as well as prescription and nonprescription agents when used to promote smoking cessation, so long 9 10 as such agents otherwise meet the definition of "covered outpatient drug" in 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1396r-8(k). However, the department may 11 initiate an individualized inquiry and determine and implement by rule 12 appropriate coverage limitations as may be required to encourage the 13 14 use of effective, evidence-based services and prescription and 15 The department shall nonprescription agents. track per-capita expenditures for a cohort of clients that receive smoking cessation 16 benefits, and submit a cost-benefit analysis to the legislature on or 17 18 before January 1, 2012.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2008, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.
