AN ACT Relating to radiologist assistants; amending RCW 18.84.010, 18.84.020, 18.84.030, 18.84.040, and 18.84.080; and adding a new section to chapter 18.84 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 18.84.010 and 1991 c 222 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 It is the intent and purpose of this chapter to protect the public 8 by the certification and registration of practitioners of radiological technology. By promoting high standards of professional performance, 9 10 by requiring professional accountability, and by credentialing those 11 persons who seek to provide radiological technology under the title of 12 ((radiological)) radiologic technologists, and by regulating all 13 persons utilizing ionizing radiation on human beings this chapter 14 identifies those practitioners who have achieved a particular level of 15 competency. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to require that individual or group policies or contracts of an insurance carrier, 16 health care service contractor, or health maintenance organization 17 18 provide benefits or coverage for services and supplies provided by a 19 person certified under this chapter.

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1 The legislature finds and declares that this chapter conforms to 2 the guidelines, terms, and definitions for the credentialing of health 3 or health-related professions specified under chapter 18.120 RCW.

4 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.84.020 and 2000 c 93 s 42 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 ((Unless the context clearly requires otherwise,)) The definitions
7 in this section apply throughout this chapter <u>unless the context</u>
8 <u>clearly requires otherwise</u>.

9 10

(1) "Department" means the department of health.

(2) "Secretary" means the secretary of health.

11 (3) "Licensed practitioner" means any licensed health care 12 practitioner performing services within the person's authorized scope 13 of practice.

14 (4) "Radiologic technologist" means an individual certified under 15 this chapter, other than a licensed practitioner, who practices 16 radiologic technology as a:

17 (a) Diagnostic radiologic technologist, who is a person who 18 actually handles X-ray equipment in the process of applying radiation 19 on a human being for diagnostic purposes at the direction of a licensed 20 practitioner, this includes parenteral procedures related to radiologic 21 technology when performed under the direct supervision of a physician 22 licensed under chapter 18.71 or 18.57 RCW; ((or))

(b) Therapeutic radiologic technologist, who is a person who uses radiation-generating equipment for therapeutic purposes on human subjects at the direction of a licensed practitioner, this includes parenteral procedures related to radiologic technology when performed under the direct supervision of a physician licensed under chapter 18.71 or 18.57 RCW; ((or))

(c) Nuclear medicine technologist, who is a person who prepares radiopharmaceuticals and administers them to human beings for diagnostic and therapeutic purposes and who performs in vivo and in vitro detection and measurement of radioactivity for medical purposes at the direction of a licensed practitioner; or

34 (d) Radiologist assistant, who is an advanced-level certified 35 diagnostic radiologic technologist who assists radiologists by 36 performing advanced diagnostic imaging procedures as determined by rule 37 under levels of supervision defined by the secretary, this includes but is not limited to enteral and parenteral procedures when performed under the direction of the supervising radiologist, and that these procedures may include injecting diagnostic agents to sites other than intravenous, performing diagnostic aspirations and localizations, and assisting radiologists with other invasive procedures.

(5) "Approved school of radiologic technology" means a school of 6 7 radiologic technology or radiologist assistant program approved by the ((council on medical education of the American medical association)) 8 secretary or a school found to maintain the equivalent of such a course 9 10 of study as determined by the department. Such school may be operated by a medical or educational institution, and for the purpose of 11 12 providing the requisite clinical experience, shall be affiliated with 13 one or more general hospitals.

14 (6) <u>"Approved radiologist assistant program" means a school</u>
15 <u>approved by the secretary. The secretary may recognize other</u>
16 <u>organizations that establish standards for radiologist assistant</u>
17 <u>programs and designate schools that meet the organization's standards</u>
18 <u>as approved.</u>

<u>(7)</u> "Radiologic technology" means the use of ionizing radiation
 upon a human being for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes.

21 (((7))) (8) "Radiologist" means a physician certified by the 22 American board of radiology or the American osteopathic board of 23 radiology.

24 ((<del>(8)</del>)) <u>(9)</u> "Registered X-ray technician" means a person who is 25 registered with the department, and who applies ionizing radiation at 26 the direction of a licensed practitioner and who does not perform 27 parenteral procedures.

28 Sec. 3. RCW 18.84.030 and 1991 c 222 s 3 are each amended to read 29 as follows:

No person may practice radiologic technology without being 30 31 registered or certified under this chapter, unless that person is a licensed practitioner as defined in RCW 18.84.020(3). 32 A person certified 33 represents himself or herself to the public as a 34 ((radiological)) radiologic technologist when that person adopts or 35 uses a title or description of services that incorporates one or more 36 of the following items or designations:

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(1) Certified radiologic technologist or CRT, for persons so
 certified under this chapter;

3 (2) Certified radiologic therapy technologist, CRTT, or CRT, for
4 persons certified in the therapeutic field;

5 (3) Certified radiologic diagnostic technologist, CRDT, or CRT, for
6 persons certified in the diagnostic field; ((<del>or</del>))

7 (4) Certified nuclear medicine technologist, CNMT, or CRT, for
 8 persons certified as nuclear medicine technologists; or

9 <u>(5) Certified radiologist assistant or CRA for persons certified as</u> 10 <u>radiologist assistants</u>.

11 **Sec. 4.** RCW 18.84.040 and 1994 sp.s. c 9 s 506 are each amended to 12 read as follows:

13 (1) In addition to any other authority provided by law, the 14 secretary may:

(a) Adopt rules, in accordance with chapter 34.05 RCW, necessary to
 implement this chapter;

17 (b) Set all registration, certification, and renewal fees in 18 accordance with RCW 43.70.250;

19 (c) Establish forms and procedures necessary to administer this 20 chapter;

(d) Evaluate and designate those schools from which graduation will be accepted as proof of an applicant's eligibility to receive a certificate;

(e) Determine whether alternative methods of training are equivalent to formal education, and to establish forms, procedures, and criteria for evaluation of an applicant's alternative training to determine the applicant's eligibility to receive a certificate;

(f) Issue a certificate to any applicant who has met the education, training, <u>examination</u>, and conduct requirements for certification; and

30 (g) Issue a registration to an applicant who meets the requirement 31 for a registration.

32 (2) The secretary may hire clerical, administrative, and33 investigative staff as needed to implement this chapter.

34 (3) The <u>uniform disciplinary act</u>, chapter 18.130 RCW, governs the
 35 issuance and denial of registrations and certifications, unregistered
 36 and uncertified practice, and the discipline of registrants and

certificants under this chapter. The secretary is the disciplining
 authority under this chapter.

3 (4) The secretary may appoint ad hoc members of the profession to 4 serve in an ad hoc advisory capacity to the secretary in carrying out 5 this chapter. The members will serve for designated times and provide 6 advice on matters specifically identified and requested by the 7 secretary. The members shall be compensated in accordance with RCW 8 43.03.220 and reimbursed for travel expenses under RCW 43.03.040 and 9 43.03.060.

10 **Sec. 5.** RCW 18.84.080 and 1991 c 3 s 209 are each amended to read 11 as follows:

12 (1) The secretary shall issue a certificate to any applicant who 13 demonstrates to the secretary's satisfaction, that the following 14 requirements have been met <u>to practice as</u>:

(a) <u>A diagnostic radiologic technologist, therapeutic radiologic</u>
 <u>technologist, or nuclear medicine technologist</u>:

17 <u>(i)</u> Graduation from an approved school or successful completion of 18 alternate training that meets the criteria established by the 19 secretary; ((and

20 (b)) (ii) Satisfactory completion of a radiologic technologist
21 examination approved by the secretary; and

22 (iii) Good moral character; or

23 (b) A radiologist assistant:

24 <u>(i) Satisfactory completion of an approved radiologist assistant</u>
25 program;

26 (ii) Satisfactory completion of a radiologist assistant examination
27 approved by the secretary; and

28 (iii) Good moral character.

(2) Applicants shall be subject to the grounds for denial orissuance of a conditional license under chapter 18.130 RCW.

31 (3) The secretary shall establish by rule what constitutes adequate 32 proof of meeting the requirements for certification and for designation 33 of certification in a particular field of radiologic technology.

34NEW SECTION.Sec. 6.A new section is added to chapter 18.84 RCW35to read as follows:

36 It is unprofessional conduct under chapter 18.130 RCW for any

- 1 person registered or certified under this chapter to interpret images,
- 2 make diagnoses, prescribe medications or therapies, or perform other
- 3 procedures that may be prohibited by rule.
