| 20 | (1) The higher education coordinating board may approve                |
| 21 | applications submitted by local governments for an area's designation  |
| 22 | as a health sciences and services authority under this chapter. The    |
| 23 | director shall determine the division to review applications submitted |

24 by local governments under this chapter. The application for

25 designation shall be in the form and manner and contain such 26 information as the higher education coordinating board may prescribe,

27 provided the application shall:

- 1 (a) Contain sufficient information to enable the director to 2 determine the viability of the proposal;
- 3 (b) Demonstrate that an ordinance or resolution has been passed by
- 4 the legislative authority of a local government that delineates the
- 5 boundaries of an area that may be designated an authority;
- 6 (c) Be submitted on behalf of the local government, or, if that 7 office does not exist, by the legislative body of the local 8 government;
- 9 (d) Demonstrate that the public funds directed to programs or 10 facilities in the authority will leverage private sector resources and 11 contributions to activities to be performed;
- 12 (e) Provide a plan or plans for the development of the authority 13 as an entity to advance as a cluster for health sciences education,
- 14 health sciences research, biotechnology development, biotechnology
- 15 product commercialization, and/or health care services; and
- 16 (f) Demonstrate that the state has previously provided funds to 17 health sciences and services programs or facilities in the applicant 18 city, town, or county.
- 19 (2) The director shall determine the division to develop criteria 20 to evaluate the application. The criteria shall include:
- 21 (a) The presence of infrastructure capable of spurring development 22 of the area as a center of health sciences and services;
- 23 (b) The presence of higher education facilities where 24 undergraduate or graduate coursework or research is conducted; and
- 25 (c) The presence of facilities in which health services are 26 provided.
- 27 (3) There shall be no more than ((<del>one authority</del>)) <u>two authorities</u> 28 statewide.
- 29 (4) An authority may only be created in a county with a population 30 of less than one million persons and is located east of the crest of 31 the Cascade mountains.
- 32 (5) The director may reject or approve an application. When 33 denying an application, the director must specify the application's 34 deficiencies. The decision regarding such designation as it relates

- 1 to a specific local government is final; however, a rejected 2 application may be resubmitted.
- 3 (6) Applications are due by December 31, ((2007))  $\underline{2009}$ , and must 4 be processed within sixty days of submission.
- 5 (7) The director may, at his or her discretion, amend the 6 boundaries of an authority upon the request of the local government.
- 7 (8) The higher education coordinating board may adopt any rules 8 necessary to implement chapter 251, Laws of 2007 within one hundred 9 twenty days of July 22, 2007.
- The higher education coordinating board must 11 evaluation and performance measures in order to evaluate 12 effectiveness of the programs in the authorities that are funded with 13 public resources. A report to the legislature shall be due on a 14 biennial basis beginning December 1, 2009. In addition, the higher 15 education coordinating board shall develop evaluation criteria that 16 enables the local governments to measure the effectiveness of the 17 program."
