1 On page 169, line 20, increase the budgeted enrollment target for 2 the University of Washington by 1,175 full-time equivalent (FTE) 3 students for each year of the biennium, and adjust the totals 4 accordingly.

5 On page 169, line 22, increase the budgeted enrollment target for 6 Central Washington University by 293 FTE students for each year of the 7 biennium, and adjust the totals accordingly.

8 On page 169, line 23, increase the budgeted enrollment target for 9 Eastern Washington University by 125 FTE students for each year of the 10 biennium and adjust the totals accordingly.

11 On page 169, line 25, increase the budgeted enrollment target for 12 Western Washington University by 165 FTE students for each year of the 13 biennium, and adjust the totals accordingly.

14 On page 264, after line 19, insert the following:

15 " Sec. 962. RCW 28B.10.695 and 2003 c 407 s 1 are each amended to 16 read as follows:

17 (1) Each four-year institution of higher education and the state 18 board for community and technical colleges shall develop policies that 19 ensure undergraduate students enrolled in degree or certificate 20 programs complete their programs in a timely manner in order to make 21 the most efficient use of instructional resources and provide capacity 22 within the institution for additional students.

(2) Policies adopted under this section shall address, but not be24 limited to, undergraduate students in the following circumstances:

(a) Students who accumulate more than one hundred twenty-five
percent of the number of credits required to complete their respective
baccalaureate or associate degree or certificate programs;

1 (b) Students who drop more than twenty-five percent of their 2 course load before the grading period for the quarter or semester, 3 which prevents efficient use of instructional resources; and

4 (c) Students who remain on academic probation for more than one 5 quarter or semester.

6 (3) Policies adopted under this section ((may)) shall include 7 assessment by the institution of a surcharge in addition to regular 8 tuition and fees to be paid by a student for continued enrollment. 9 The amount of the surcharge shall result in a tuition fees assessment 10 for that student equivalent to the full cost of instruction for the 11 subsequent quarter or semester after a finding that a policy under 12 subsection (2) of this section has been violated. The surcharge shall 13 continue to be assessed until the institution of higher education 14 determines that the policy is no longer being violated.

15 (4) It is presumed that the surcharge shall apply to all students 16 described in subsection (2) of this section unless the student 17 presents to his or her registrar evidence that one or more of the 18 following exemptions apply:

19 (a) The student is a dislocated worker as defined by RCW 50.04.075
20 or a person engaging in a job training program under the purview of
21 the workforce training and education coordinating board;

(b) The student participates in the border county higher education
23 opportunity project under RCW 28B.76.685;

24 (c) The student is a certificated teacher of the K-12 school 25 system pursuing continuing education credits according to 26 certification requirements; or

27 (d) The student has not been enrolled in an institution of higher
 28 education during the preceding five years.

29 (5) Students who believe they are under extraordinary or 30 unforeseen academic or personal circumstances or were unable to 31 complete their baccalaureate degree program within the number of 32 credits specified due to institutional constraints may petition the 33 institution of higher education for a special waiver from the tuition 34 surcharge provisions of subsection (3) of this section. The 3 process shall include a one hundred dollar administrative fee. The 4 entire amount of the fee shall be refunded for those students who make 5 <u>a successful petition.</u>

6 (6) For the purposes of this section, "full cost of instruction" 7 means the average instructional support in state general funds and 8 tuition fees, as defined in RCW 28B.15.020, per full-time equivalent 9 undergraduate at each institution of higher education for that 10 academic year.

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12 Sec. 963. RCW 28B.15.910 and 2008 c 188 s 3 are each amended to 13 read as follows:

(1) For the purpose of providing state general fund support to 14 15 public institutions of higher education, except for revenue waived 16 under programs listed in subsections (3) and (4) of this section, and expressly provided 17 unless otherwise in the omnibus state 18 appropriations act, the total amount of operating fees revenue waived, 19 exempted, or reduced by a state university, a regional university, The 20 Evergreen State College, or the community colleges as a whole, shall 21 not exceed the percentage of total gross authorized operating fees 22 revenue in this subsection. As used in this section, "gross 23 authorized operating fees revenue" means the estimated gross operating 24 fees revenue as estimated under RCW 82.33.020 or as revised by the 25 office of financial management, before granting any waivers. This 26 limitation applies to all tuition waiver programs established before 27 or after July 1, 1992.

6	(5) The institutions of higher	education wil	l participate in

7 outreach activities to increase the number of veterans who receive 8 tuition waivers. Colleges and universities shall revise the 9 application for admissions so that all applicants shall have the 10 opportunity to advise the institution that they are veterans who need 11 assistance. If a person indicates on the application for admissions 12 that the person is a veteran who is in need of assistance, then the 13 institution of higher education shall ask the person whether they have 14 any funds disbursed in accordance with the Montgomery GI Bill 15 available to them. Each institution shall encourage veterans to 16 utilize funds available to them in accordance with the Montgomery GI 17 Bill prior to providing the veteran a tuition waiver.

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20 Renumber the sections consecutively and correct any internal 21 references accordingly.

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<u>EFFECT:</u> Lowers the public higher education institutions' authority to waive tuition by approximately 10 percent below the amounts actually waived in academic year 2007-08. With certain exceptions and appeal rights provided, requires the public baccalaureate institutions to charge the full cost of instruction to students who have earned more than 125 percent of the credits required for a baccalaureate degree, who dropped more than 25 percent of their course load during the previous quarter, or who have been on academic probation for more than one quarter. Based on the additional tuition revenues available as a result of these changes, an estimated 3,900 more full-time equivalent students (FTE-S) would have access to the public higher education institutions. (Of the 3,900 FTE total, approximately 1,800 FTE-S result in higher budgeted enrollment targets at the UW, Central, Eastern, and Western. The remaining 2,100 additional FTE-S represent some of the current "over-enrollment" that would likely otherwise have been dropped at the public funding level provided in the original budget proposal.)
