7 (a) Retired or disabled state employees, retired or disabled 8 school employees, retired or disabled employees of county, municipal, 9 or other political subdivisions, or retired or disabled employees of 10 tribal governments covered by this chapter may continue their 11 participation in insurance plans and contracts after retirement or 12 disablement;

(b) Separated employees may continue their participation in 14 insurance plans and contracts if participation is selected immediately 15 upon separation from employment;

(c) Surviving spouses and dependent children of emergency service personnel killed in the line of duty <u>and</u>, between the effective date of this act and June 30, 2011, surviving spouses and dependent children of law enforcement officers and firefighters who are totally disabled in the line of duty and receiving a retirement allowance as provided under RCW 41.26.470(8) may participate in <u>health</u> insurance ((plans and contracts));

(d) Between the effective date of this act and June 30, 2011, law enforcement officers and firefighters who are totally disabled in the line of duty and receiving a retirement allowance as provided under RCW 41.26.470(8) and their dependents may participate in health insurance. 1 (2) Rates charged surviving spouses of emergency service personnel 2 killed in the line of duty, <u>law enforcement officers and firefighters</u> 3 who are totally disabled in the line of duty and receiving a 4 retirement allowance as provided under RCW 41.26.470(8) and their 5 <u>dependents</u>, retired or disabled employees, separated employees, 6 spouses, or dependent children who are not eligible for parts A and B 7 of medicare shall be based on the experience of the community-rated 8 risk pool established under RCW 41.05.022.

9 (3) Rates charged to surviving spouses of emergency service 10 personnel killed in the line of duty, <u>law enforcement officers and</u> 11 <u>firefighters who are totally disabled in the line of duty and</u> 12 <u>receiving a retirement allowance as provided under RCW 41.26.470(8)</u> 13 <u>and their dependents</u>, retired or disabled employees, separated 14 employees, spouses, or children who are eligible for parts A and B of 15 medicare shall be calculated from a separate experience risk pool 16 comprised only of individuals eligible for parts A and B of medicare; 17 however, the premiums charged to medicare-eligible retirees and 18 disabled employees shall be reduced by the amount of the subsidy 19 provided under RCW 41.05.085.

(4) Surviving spouses and dependent children of emergency service personnel killed in the line of duty, law enforcement officers and firefighters who are totally disabled in the line of duty and receiving a retirement allowance as provided under RCW 41.26.470(8) and their dependents, and retired or disabled and separated employees shall be responsible for payment of premium rates developed by the authority which shall include the cost to the authority of providing <u>health</u> insurance ((coverage)) including any amounts necessary for reserves and administration in accordance with this chapter. These self pay rates will be established based on a separate rate for the employee, the spouse, and the children.

31 (((5))) <u>(6)</u> The term "retired state employees" for the purpose of 32 this section shall include but not be limited to members of the 33 legislature whether voluntarily or involuntarily leaving state office.

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1 Sec. 10. RCW 41.05.195 and 2007 c 114 s 7 are each amended to 2 read as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter or rules or 3 4 procedures adopted by the authority, the authority shall make 5 available to retired or disabled employees who are enrolled in parts A 6 and B of medicare one or more medicare supplemental insurance policies 7 that conform to the requirements of chapter 48.66 RCW. The policies 8 shall be chosen in consultation with the public employees' benefits 9 board. These policies shall be made available to retired or disabled 10 state employees; retired or disabled school district employees; 11 retired employees of county, municipal, other political or 12 subdivisions or retired employees of tribal governments eligible for 13 coverage available under the authority;  $((\Theta r))$  surviving spouses of 14 emergency service personnel killed in the line of duty; or law 15 enforcement officers and firefighters who are totally disabled in the 16 line of duty and receiving a retirement allowance as provided under 17 RCW 41.26.470(8), and who are participating under the provisions of 18 subsection (1)(d) of section 9 of this act, or their dependents."

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20 On page 20, on line 5, strike "This act takes effect January 1, 2010." 21 and insert "Sections 9 and 10 of this act are necessary for the 22 immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or 23 support of the state government and its existing public institutions, 24 and take effect immediately. The remaining sections of this act take 25 effect January 1, 2010."

1 On page 1, line 5 of the title, before "and providing", insert 2 "declaring an emergency;".

<u>EFFECT:</u> Makes law enforcement officers and fire fighters who were totally disabled in the line of duty - and, as applicable, their surviving spouses and dependents - eligible for participation in PEBB insurance plans between the effective date of the act and June 30, 2011. Declares an emergency so that the new sections take effect immediately.

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
