Background: Owners of farm vehicles where the gross vehicle weight for a combination vehicle that does not exceed 80,000 pounds or 40,000 pounds for a single unit vehicle may operate these vehicles using a trip permit. Each farm vehicle trip permit is authorized for the period that is remaining in a calendar month. No more than four permits are allowed for any one vehicle in any 12-month period. The fee for each farm permit is \$6.25 and is sold by Department of Licensing's (DOL) agents or subagents.

Summary of Bill: Commercial vehicles when licensed to a total gross weight of 80,000 pounds or a three or more axle single vehicle that has been licensed to a total gross weight of 40,000 pounds, a temporary tonnage permit to haul loads in excess of these limits may be issued. This permit is valid for periods of not less than five days at \$2.80 per day for each 2,000 pounds or fraction there of. The fee for temporary additional tonnage permits is collected by Department of Transportation (DOT).
