1 AN ACT Relating to changing the membership on the capitol campus  
2 design advisory committee; and amending RCW 43.34.080.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 43.34.080 and 1990 c 93 s 1 are each amended to read  
5 as follows:

6 (1) The capitol campus design advisory committee is established as  
7 an advisory group to the capitol committee and the director of general  
8 administration to review programs, planning, design, and landscaping of  
9 state capitol facilities and grounds and to make recommendations that  
10 will contribute to the attainment of architectural, aesthetic,  
11 functional, and environmental excellence in design and maintenance of  
12 capitol facilities on campus and located in neighboring communities.

13 (2) The advisory committee shall consist of the following persons  
14 who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the governor:

15 (a) Two architects;

16 (b) A landscape architect; and

17 (c) An urban planner.

18 The governor shall appoint the chair and vice-chair and shall  
19 instruct the director of general administration to provide the staff

1 and resources necessary for implementing this section. The advisory  
2 committee shall meet at least once every ninety days and at the call of  
3 the chair.

4 The members of the committee shall be reimbursed as provided in RCW  
5 43.03.220 and 44.04.120.

6 (3) The advisory committee shall also consist of the secretary of  
7 state (~~(and)~~); two members of the house of representatives, one from  
8 each caucus, who shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of  
9 representatives(~~(, and)~~); two members of the senate, one from each  
10 caucus, who shall be appointed by the president of the senate; and the  
11 mayor of the city of Olympia.

12 (4) The advisory committee shall review plans and designs affecting  
13 state capitol facilities as they are developed. The advisory  
14 committee's review shall include:

15 (a) The process of solicitation and selection of appropriate  
16 professional design services including design-build proposals;

17 (b) Compliance with the capitol campus master plan and design  
18 concepts as adopted by the capitol committee;

19 (c) The design, siting, and grouping of state capitol facilities  
20 relative to the service needs of state government and the impact upon  
21 the local community's economy, environment, traffic patterns, and other  
22 factors;

23 (d) The relationship of overall state capitol facility planning to  
24 the respective comprehensive plans for long-range urban development of  
25 the cities of Olympia, Lacey, and Tumwater, and Thurston county; and

26 (e) Landscaping plans and designs, including planting proposals,  
27 street furniture, sculpture, monuments, and access to the capitol  
28 campus and buildings.
