1 AN ACT Relating to granting the insurance commissioner certain 2 authority when the governor declares a state of emergency; and amending 3 RCW 48.02.060.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 48.02.060 and 1947 c 79 s .02.06 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) The commissioner ((shall-have)) has the authority expressly
8 conferred upon him or her by or reasonably implied from the provisions
9 of this code.

10 (2) The commissioner shall execute his <u>or her</u> duties and shall 11 enforce the provisions of this code.

12 (3) The commissioner may:

(a) Make reasonable rules ((and regulations)) for effectuating any
provision of this code, except those relating to his <u>or her</u> election,
qualifications, or compensation. ((No such)) <u>R</u>ules ((and regulations
shall-be)) <u>are not</u> effective prior to their being filed for public
inspection in the commissioner's office.

(b) Conduct investigations to determine whether any person hasviolated any provision of this code.

- (c) Conduct examinations, investigations, hearings, in addition to
 those specifically provided for, useful and proper for the efficient
 administration of any provision of this code.
- 4 <u>(4) When the governor proclaims a state of emergency under RCW</u> 5 <u>43.06.010(12)</u>, the commissioner may issue an order that addresses any
- 6 or all of the following matters related to insurance policies issued in
- 7 <u>this state:</u>
- 8 <u>(a) Reporting requirements for claims;</u>
- 9 (b) Grace periods for payment of insurance premiums and performance 10 of other duties by insureds;
- 11 (c) Temporary postponement of cancellations and renewals; and
- 12 (d) Medical coverage to ensure access to care.
- 13 (5) An order by the commissioner under subsection (4) of this 14 section may remain effective for not more than thirty days unless the commissioner extends the termination date for the order for an 15 additional period of not more than thirty days or for subsequent 16 additional periods of not more than thirty days. The commissioner may 17 extend the order if, in the commissioner's judgment, the circumstances 18 warrant an extension. An order of the commissioner under subsection 19 (4) of this section is not effective after the related state of 20 21 emergency is terminated by proclamation of the governor under RCW 43.06.210. The order must specify, by line of insurance: 22
- (a) The geographic areas in which the order applies, which must be
 within but may be less extensive than the geographic area specified in
 the governor's proclamation of a state of emergency and must be
 specific according to an appropriate means of delineation, such as the
 United States postal service zip codes or other appropriate means; and
 (b) The date on which the order becomes effective and the date on
- 29 which the order terminates.
- 30 <u>(6) The commissioner may adopt rules that establish general</u> 31 <u>criteria for orders issued under subsection (4) of this section and may</u> 32 <u>adopt emergency rules applicable to a specific proclamation of a state</u> 33 <u>of emergency by the governor.</u>
- 34 (7) The rule-making authority set forth in subsection (6) of this
 35 section does not limit or affect the rule-making authority otherwise
 36 granted to the commissioner by law.

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
