AN ACT Relating to the modification of the governing boards of state colleges and universities; amending RCW 28B.20.100, 28B.30.100, 28B.35.100, and 28B.40.100; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

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NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that:

6 (1) College and university faculty members are specialists with 7 extensive experience in teaching and learning assessment, as well as 8 expertise in specialized fields that directly benefit their 9 institutions and the people of the state;

10 (2) College and university faculty members are innovators who conduct research to discover new technologies and produce knowledge, 11 design courses and curricula, assess student development, train 12 13 teachers, supervise student research, and pursue grants and funding for 14 programs and projects that drive the economy and civic life of our 15 state; their efforts can affect the health, economy, and social well-16 being of its citizens and communities, and assist in the production of cultural and artistic achievements that benefit citizens throughout the 17 18 state;

1 (3) College and university faculty members participate in the 2 fundamental missions of their institutions by designing and monitoring 3 programs, including standards, curricula, and degree requirements, at 4 the level of department school/college, and for the college or 5 university as a whole;

6 (4) The boards of regents and trustees of Washington's universities 7 and colleges are charged with the establishment of their admission and 8 degree requirements to schools, colleges, and departments, and are 9 responsible for assessing the outcomes and budgeting of state funds;

10 (5) Faculty can provide valuable insights into the fundamental 11 missions of the colleges and universities that will encourage and 12 support innovative thinking, bring an important, long-range perspective 13 to board deliberations, and contribute a wealth of experience in 14 assessment of viable educational practices;

15 (6) Faculty, like all member of boards of regents or trustees, 16 represent the citizens of the state and not specific constituencies; 17 and

(7) RCW 28B.10.520 stipulates that "each member of a board of 18 regents or board of trustees of a university or other state institution 19 of higher education, before entering upon his duties, shall take and 20 21 subscribe an oath to discharge faithfully and honestly his duties and 22 to perform strictly and impartially the same to the best of his 23 ability, such oath to be filed with the secretary of state." This oath 24 is further defined by the ethics in public service act chapter 42.52 RCW and individual boards' policies for avoiding conflict of interest 25 26 in decision making.

27 **Sec. 2.** RCW 28B.20.100 and 2006 c 78 s 1 are each amended to read 28 as follows:

29 (1) The governance of the University of Washington shall be vested in a board of regents to consist of ((ten)) eleven members, one of whom 30 shall be a student and, beginning with the first appointment after the 31 effective date of this section, one of whom shall be a full-time or 32 emeritus member of the faculty of the university at the time of 33 34 appointment. The governor shall select the student member from a list 35 of candidates, of at least three and not more than five, submitted by 36 the governing body of the associated students. ((They)) The governor 37 shall select the faculty member from a list of five candidates

submitted by the governing body of the university faculty. Board 1 2 members shall be appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate, and, except for the student member, shall hold their offices 3 4 for a term of six years from the first day of October and until their successors shall be appointed and qualified. The student member shall 5 hold his or her office for a term of one year from the first day of б July until the first day of July of the following year or until his or 7 8 her successor is appointed and qualified, whichever is later. The student member shall be a full-time student in good standing at the 9 10 university at the time of appointment.

11 (2) Six members of said board shall constitute a quorum for the 12 transaction of business. In the case of a vacancy, or when an 13 appointment is made after the date of the expiration of a term, the 14 governor shall fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the 15 regent whose office has become vacant or expired.

16 (3) Except for the term of the student member, no more than the 17 terms of two members will expire simultaneously on the last day of 18 September in any one year.

(4) A student appointed under this section shall excuse himself or
herself from participation or voting on matters relating to the hiring,
discipline, or tenure of faculty members and personnel.

22 (5) The faculty member appointed under this section shall excuse 23 himself or herself from decisions affecting faculty compensation, 24 including union contracts.

25 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.30.100 and 2006 c 78 s 2 are each amended to read 26 as follows:

27 (1) The governance of Washington State University shall be vested in a board of regents to consist of ((ten)) eleven members one of whom 28 29 shall be a student and, beginning with the first appointment after the effective date of this section, one of whom shall be a full-time or 30 emeritus member of the faculty of the university at the time of 31 appointment. The governor shall select the student member from a list 32 of candidates, of at least three and not more than five, submitted by 33 34 the governing body of the associated students. ((They)) The governor 35 shall select the faculty member from a list of five candidates submitted by the governing body of the university faculty. Board 36 37 members shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the consent of

the senate and, except for the student member, shall hold their offices 1 2 for a term of six years from the first day of October and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The student member shall hold 3 4 his or her office for a term of one year from the first day of July until the first day of July of the following year or until his or her 5 successor is appointed and qualified, whichever is later. The student б 7 member shall be a full-time student in good standing at the university 8 at the time of appointment.

9 (2) Six members of said board shall constitute a quorum for the 10 transaction of business. In the case of a vacancy or when an 11 appointment is made after the date of the expiration of a term, the 12 governor shall fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the 13 regent whose office has become vacant or expired.

14 (3) Except for the term of the student member, no more than the 15 terms of two members will expire simultaneously on the last day of 16 September in any one year.

(4) Each regent shall, before entering upon the discharge of his 17 respective duties as such, execute a good and sufficient bond to the 18 state of Washington, with two or more sufficient sureties, residents of 19 the state, or with a surety company licensed to do business within the 20 21 state, in the penal sum of not less than five thousand dollars, 22 conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties as such regent: 23 PROVIDED, That the university shall pay any fees incurred for any such 24 bonds for their board members.

(5) A student appointed under this section shall excuse himself or
 herself from participation or voting on matters relating to the hiring,
 discipline, or tenure of faculty members and personnel.

28 (6) The faculty member appointed under this section shall excuse 29 himself or herself from decisions affecting faculty compensation, 30 including union contracts.

31 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28B.35.100 and 2006 c 78 s 3 are each amended to read 32 as follows:

(1) The governance of each of the regional universities shall be vested in a board of trustees consisting of ((eight)) <u>nine</u> members, one of whom shall be a student <u>and</u>, <u>beginning with the first appointment</u> <u>after the effective date of this section</u>, <u>one of whom shall be a full-</u> <u>time or emeritus member of the faculty of the respective university at</u>

the time of appointment. The governor shall select the student member 1 from a list of candidates, of at least three and not more than five, 2 3 submitted by the governing body of the associated students. ((They)) 4 The governor shall select the faculty member from a list of five candidates submitted by the governing body of the university faculty. 5 Board members shall be appointed by the governor with the consent of б 7 the senate and, except for the student member, shall hold their offices 8 for a term of six years from the first day of October and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The student member shall hold 9 10 his or her office for a term of one year from the first day of July and until the first day of July of the following year or until his or her 11 12 successor is appointed and qualified, whichever is later. The student 13 member shall be a full-time student in good standing at the respective 14 university at the time of appointment.

15 (2) Five members of the board constitute a quorum for the 16 transaction of business. In case of a vacancy, or when an appointment 17 is made after the date of expiration of the term, the governor shall 18 fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the trustee whose 19 office has become vacant or expired.

20 (3) Except for the term of the student member, no more than the 21 terms of two members will expire simultaneously on the last day of 22 September in any one year.

(4) A student appointed under this section shall excuse himself or
 herself from participation or voting on matters relating to the hiring,
 discipline, or tenure of faculty members and personnel.

26 (5) The faculty member appointed under this section shall excuse 27 himself or herself from decisions affecting faculty compensation, 28 including union contracts.

29 Sec. 5. RCW 28B.40.100 and 2006 c 78 s 4 are each amended to read 30 as follows:

(1) The governance of The Evergreen State College shall be vested in a board of trustees consisting of ((eight)) <u>nine</u> members, one of whom shall be a student <u>and</u>, <u>beginning with the first appointment after</u> the effective date of this section, one of whom shall be a full-time or emeritus member of the faculty of the college at the time of appointment. The governor shall select the student member from a list of candidates, of at least three and not more than five, submitted by

the student body. ((They)) The governor shall select the faculty 1 2 member from a list of five candidates submitted by the college faculty. Board members shall be appointed by the governor with the consent of 3 4 the senate and, except for the student member, shall hold their offices for a term of six years from the first day of October and until their 5 successors are appointed and qualified. The student member shall hold б his or her office for a term of one year from the first day of July and 7 8 until the first day of July of the following year or until his or her successor is appointed and qualified, whichever is later. The student 9 10 member shall be a full-time student in good standing at the college at 11 the time of appointment.

12 (2) Five members of the board constitute a quorum for the 13 transaction of business. In case of a vacancy, or when an appointment 14 is made after the date of expiration of the term, the governor shall 15 fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the trustee whose 16 office has become vacant or expired.

17 (3) Except for the term of the student member, no more than the 18 terms of two members will expire simultaneously on the last day of 19 September in any one year.

(4) A student appointed under this section shall excuse himself or
herself from participation or voting on matters relating to the hiring,
discipline, or tenure of faculty members and personnel.

23 (5) The faculty member appointed under this section shall excuse 24 himself or herself from decisions affecting faculty compensation, 25 including union contracts.

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
