- 1 AN ACT Relating to adopting the interstate compact on mental
- 2 health; adding a new chapter to Title 7 RCW; and declaring an
- 3 emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that providing for the
- 6 surrender of persons who have been found not guilty by reason of
- 7 insanity, and who have fled from a state where they were under an order
- 8 of detention, commitment, or conditional release or their return to the
- 9 state from which they fled, consistent with the interstate compact on
- 10 mental health, will promote public safety.
- 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply
- 12 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- 13 (1) "Flight" or "fled" means a departure from a state in which a
- 14 person was under detention, commitment, or conditional release due to
- 15 a finding of not guilty by reason of insanity.
- 16 (2) "Governor" means the governor of a state or the executive
- 17 authority of the District of Columbia.

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- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** The governor of this state may arrest and
- 2 transfer a person, in this state, who has been found not guilty by
- 3 reason of insanity and who has fled from detention, commitment, or
- 4 conditional release.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** The governor of this state may demand the
- 6 return to the state of Washington any person who has been found not
- 7 guilty by reason of insanity and who has fled from detention,
- 8 commitment, or conditional release in this state.
- 9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Except as otherwise specifically provided in
- 10 this chapter, state and local officials and the courts shall have the
- 11 same powers and follow the same procedures in effecting the provisions
- 12 of this chapter as are set forth in the uniform criminal extradition
- 13 act, chapter 10.88 RCW.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** Except as otherwise specifically provided in
- 15 this chapter, persons subject to arrest, surrender, or return under
- 16 this chapter have the same rights provided to persons accused or
- 17 convicted of crimes under the uniform criminal extradition act, chapter
- 18 10.88 RCW.
- 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** If any provision of this act or its
- 20 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
- 21 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other
- 22 persons or circumstances is not affected.
- 23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** This act applies retroactively to any
- 24 circumstances that occurred or demands for surrender or return that
- 25 were made before the effective date of this act.
- 26 NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. Sections 1 through 8 of this act constitute
- 27 a new chapter in Title 7 RCW.
- 28 NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. This act is necessary for the immediate
- 29 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the

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- 1 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 2 immediately.

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
