SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2759

By House Education Appropriations (originally sponsored by Representatives Maxwell, Anderson, Roberts, White, Goodman, Clibborn, Kenney, Hunter, Morrell, and Haigh)

- 1 AN ACT Relating to adjusting local school finance related to 2 nonresident students enrolled in online learning; amending RCW
- 3 84.52.0531 and 84.52.0531; creating a new section; providing an
- 4 effective date; and providing an expiration date.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** While the legislature supports online
- 7 learning, the legislature finds that there are unintended financial
- 8 consequences for taxpayers, both locally and statewide, when
- 9 significant numbers of nonresident students enroll in a school district
- 10 for purposes of enrolling in an online school program. Therefore, the
- 11 legislature intends to adjust finance policy related to voter-approved
- 12 excess levies and a district's qualification for local effort
- 13 enhancement funds to eliminate these unintended consequences.
- 14 Sec. 2. RCW 84.52.0531 and 2009 c 4 s 908 are each amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- The maximum dollar amount which may be levied by or for any school
- 17 district for maintenance and operation support under the provisions of
- 18 RCW 84.52.053 shall be determined as follows:

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(1) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 1997, the maximum dollar amount shall be calculated pursuant to the laws and rules in effect in November 1996.

- (2) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 1998 and thereafter, the maximum dollar amount shall be the sum of (a) plus or minus (b) and (c) of this subsection minus (d) of this subsection:
- (a) The district's levy base as defined in subsections (3) and (4) of this section multiplied by the district's maximum levy percentage as defined in subsection (5) of this section;
- (b) For districts in a high/nonhigh relationship, the high school district's maximum levy amount shall be reduced and the nonhigh school district's maximum levy amount shall be increased by an amount equal to the estimated amount of the nonhigh payment due to the high school district under RCW 28A.545.030(3) and 28A.545.050 for the school year commencing the year of the levy;
- (c) For districts in an interdistrict cooperative agreement, the nonresident school district's maximum levy amount shall be reduced and the resident school district's maximum levy amount shall be increased by an amount equal to the per pupil basic education allocation included in the nonresident district's levy base under subsection (3) of this section multiplied by:
- (i) The number of full-time equivalent students served from the resident district in the prior school year; multiplied by:
- (ii) The serving district's maximum levy percentage determined under subsection (5) of this section; increased by:
- (iii) The percent increase per full-time equivalent student as stated in the state basic education appropriation section of the biennial budget between the prior school year and the current school year divided by fifty-five percent;
- (d) The district's maximum levy amount shall be reduced by the maximum amount of state matching funds for which the district is eligible under RCW 28A.500.010.
- (3) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 2005 and thereafter, a district's levy base shall be the sum of allocations in (a) through (c) of this subsection received by the district for the prior school year and the amounts determined under subsection (4) of this section, including allocations for compensation increases, plus the sum of such allocations multiplied by the percent increase per full

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time equivalent student as stated in the state basic education 1 2 appropriation section of the biennial budget between the prior school year and the current school year and divided by fifty-five percent. A 3 district's levy base shall not include local school district property 4 tax levies or other local revenues, or state and federal allocations 5 6 not identified in (a) through (c) of this subsection. <u>In addition, for</u> excess levies for collection in calendar year 2011 and 2012, a 7 district's levy base shall not include more than five hundred thousand 8 9 dollars of state or federal allocations attributable to nonresident students enrolled in the district in an online school program as 10 defined under RCW 28A.250.010 based on an interdistrict agreement or 11 under the provisions of RCW 28A.225.020 through 28A.225.030. For 12 excess levies for calendar year 2013 and thereafter, a district's levy 13 base shall not include state or federal allocations attributable to 14 nonresident students enrolled in the district in an online school 15 16 program as defined under RCW 28A.250.010 based on an interdistrict agreement or under the provisions of RCW 28A.225.020 through 17 28A.225.030. 18

- 19 (a) The district's basic education allocation as determined 20 pursuant to RCW 28A.150.250, 28A.150.260, and 28A.150.350;
- 21 (b) State and federal categorical allocations for the following 22 programs:
 - (i) Pupil transportation;
- 24 (ii) Special education;

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- (iii) Education of highly capable students;
- (iv) Compensatory education, including but not limited to learning assistance, migrant education, Indian education, refugee programs, and bilingual education;
 - (v) Food services; and
 - (vi) Statewide block grant programs; and
- 31 (c) Any other federal allocations for elementary and secondary 32 school programs, including direct grants, other than federal impact aid 33 funds and allocations in lieu of taxes.
- 34 (4) For levy collections in calendar years 2005 through 2011, in addition to the allocations included under subsection (3)(a) through (c) of this section, a district's levy base shall also include the following:

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(a) The difference between the allocation the district would have received in the current school year had RCW 84.52.068 not been amended by chapter 19, Laws of 2003 1st sp. sess. and the allocation the district received in the current school year pursuant to RCW 84.52.068. The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall offset the amount added to a district's levy base pursuant to this subsection (4)(a) by any additional per student allocations included in a district's levy base pursuant to the enactment of an initiative to the people subsequent to June 10, 2004; and

- (b) The difference between the allocations the district would have received the prior school year had RCW 28A.400.205 not been amended by chapter 20, Laws of 2003 1st sp. sess. and the allocations the district actually received the prior school year pursuant to RCW 28A.400.205. The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall offset the amount added to a district's levy base pursuant to this subsection (4)(b) by any additional salary increase allocations included in a district's levy base pursuant to the enactment of an initiative to the people subsequent to June 10, 2004.
- (5) A district's maximum levy percentage shall be twenty-two percent in 1998 and twenty-four percent in 1999 and every year thereafter; plus, for qualifying districts, the grandfathered percentage determined as follows:
- 23 (a) For 1997, the difference between the district's 1993 maximum 24 levy percentage and twenty percent; and
 - (b) For 1998 and thereafter, the percentage calculated as follows:
 - (i) Multiply the grandfathered percentage for the prior year times the district's levy base determined under subsection (3) of this section;
 - (ii) Reduce the result of (b)(i) of this subsection by any levy reduction funds as defined in subsection (6) of this section that are to be allocated to the district for the current school year;
 - (iii) Divide the result of (b)(ii) of this subsection by the district's levy base; and
- 34 (iv) Take the greater of zero or the percentage calculated in (b)(iii) of this subsection.
- 36 (6) "Levy reduction funds" shall mean increases in state funds from 37 the prior school year for programs included under subsections (3) and 38 (4) of this section: (a) That are not attributable to enrollment

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- changes, compensation increases, or inflationary adjustments; and (b) 1 2 that are or were specifically identified as levy reduction funds in the 3 appropriations act. If levy reduction funds are dependent on formula 4 factors which would not be finalized until after the start of the current school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall 5 estimate the total amount of levy reduction funds by using prior school 6 7 year data in place of current school year data. Levy reduction funds 8 shall not include moneys received by school districts from cities or counties. 9
- 10 (7) For the purposes of this section, "prior school year" means the 11 most recent school year completed prior to the year in which the levies 12 are to be collected.
- 13 (8) For the purposes of this section, "current school year" means 14 the year immediately following the prior school year.
- 15 (9) Funds collected from transportation vehicle fund tax levies 16 shall not be subject to the levy limitations in this section.
- 17 (10) The superintendent of public instruction shall develop rules 18 and regulations and inform school districts of the pertinent data 19 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
- 20 (11) For calendar year 2009, the office of the superintendent of 21 public instruction shall recalculate school district levy authority to 22 reflect levy rates certified by school districts for calendar year 23 2009.
- 24 **Sec. 3.** RCW 84.52.0531 and 1997 c 259 s 2 are each amended to read 25 as follows:

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The maximum dollar amount which may be levied by or for any school district for maintenance and operation support under the provisions of RCW 84.52.053 shall be determined as follows:

- (1) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 1997, the maximum dollar amount shall be calculated pursuant to the laws and rules in effect in November 1996.
- (2) For excess levies for collection in calendar year 1998 and thereafter, the maximum dollar amount shall be the sum of (a) plus or minus (b) and (c) of this subsection minus (d) of this subsection:
- 35 (a) The district's levy base as defined in subsection (3) of this 36 section multiplied by the district's maximum levy percentage as defined 37 in subsection (4) of this section;

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(b) For districts in a high/nonhigh relationship, the high school district's maximum levy amount shall be reduced and the nonhigh school district's maximum levy amount shall be increased by an amount equal to the estimated amount of the nonhigh payment due to the high school district under RCW 28A.545.030(3) and 28A.545.050 for the school year commencing the year of the levy;

- (c) For districts in an interdistrict cooperative agreement, the nonresident school district's maximum levy amount shall be reduced and the resident school district's maximum levy amount shall be increased by an amount equal to the per pupil basic education allocation included in the nonresident district's levy base under subsection (3) of this section multiplied by:
- (i) The number of full-time equivalent students served from the resident district in the prior school year; multiplied by:
- (ii) The serving district's maximum levy percentage determined under subsection (4) of this section; increased by:
- (iii) The percent increase per full-time equivalent student as stated in the state basic education appropriation section of the biennial budget between the prior school year and the current school year divided by fifty-five percent;
- (d) The district's maximum levy amount shall be reduced by the maximum amount of state matching funds for which the district is eligible under RCW 28A.500.010.
- thereafter, a district's levy base shall be the sum of allocations in (a) through (c) of this subsection received by the district for the prior school year, including allocations for compensation increases, plus the sum of such allocations multiplied by the percent increase per full time equivalent student as stated in the state basic education appropriation section of the biennial budget between the prior school year and the current school year and divided by fifty-five percent. A district's levy base shall not include local school district property tax levies or other local revenues, or state and federal allocations not identified in (a) through (c) of this subsection. In addition, for excess levies for collection in calendar year 2011 and 2012, a district's levy base shall not include more than five hundred thousand dollars of state or federal allocations attributable to nonresident students enrolled in the district in an online school program as

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- 1 <u>defined under RCW 28A.250.010</u> based on an interdistrict agreement or
- 2 under the provisions of RCW 28A.225.020 through 28A.225.030. For
- 3 excess levies for calendar year 2013 and thereafter, a district's levy
- 4 <u>base shall not include state or federal allocations attributable to</u>
- 5 <u>nonresident students enrolled in the district in an online school</u>
- 6 program as defined under RCW 28A.250.010 based on an interdistrict
- 7 agreement or under the provisions of RCW 28A.225.020 through
- 8 <u>28A.225.030.</u>

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- 9 (a) The district's basic education allocation as determined 10 pursuant to RCW 28A.150.250, 28A.150.260, and 28A.150.350;
- 11 (b) State and federal categorical allocations for the following 12 programs:
 - (i) Pupil transportation;
- 14 (ii) Special education;
- 15 (iii) Education of highly capable students;
- 16 (iv) Compensatory education, including but not limited to learning 17 assistance, migrant education, Indian education, refugee programs, and 18 bilingual education;
- 19 (v) Food services; and
- 20 (vi) Statewide block grant programs; and
- 21 (c) Any other federal allocations for elementary and secondary 22 school programs, including direct grants, other than federal impact aid 23 funds and allocations in lieu of taxes.
 - (4) A district's maximum levy percentage shall be twenty-two percent in 1998 and twenty-four percent in 1999 and every year thereafter; plus, for qualifying districts, the grandfathered percentage determined as follows:
- 28 (a) For 1997, the difference between the district's 1993 maximum 29 levy percentage and twenty percent; and
 - (b) For 1998 and thereafter, the percentage calculated as follows:
- (i) Multiply the grandfathered percentage for the prior year times the district's levy base determined under subsection (3) of this section;
- (ii) Reduce the result of (b)(i) of this subsection by any levy reduction funds as defined in subsection (5) of this section that are to be allocated to the district for the current school year;
- 37 (iii) Divide the result of (b)(ii) of this subsection by the 38 district's levy base; and

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- 1 (iv) Take the greater of zero or the percentage calculated in 2 (b)(iii) of this subsection.
- (5) "Levy reduction funds" shall mean increases in state funds from 3 the prior school year for programs included under subsection (3) of 4 this section: (a) That are not attributable to enrollment changes, 5 compensation increases, or inflationary adjustments; and (b) that are 6 7 or were specifically identified as levy reduction funds in the 8 appropriations act. If levy reduction funds are dependent on formula factors which would not be finalized until after the start of the 9 current school year, the superintendent of public instruction shall 10 estimate the total amount of levy reduction funds by using prior school 11 12 year data in place of current school year data. Levy reduction funds 13 shall not include moneys received by school districts from cities or counties. 14
- 15 (6) For the purposes of this section, "prior school year" means the 16 most recent school year completed prior to the year in which the levies 17 are to be collected.
 - (7) For the purposes of this section, "current school year" means the year immediately following the prior school year.
- 20 (8) Funds collected from transportation vehicle fund tax levies 21 shall not be subject to the levy limitations in this section.
- 22 (9) The superintendent of public instruction shall develop rules 23 and regulations and inform school districts of the pertinent data 24 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Section 2 of this act expires January 1, 26 2012.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. Section 3 of this act takes effect January 1, 2012.

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
