AN ACT Relating to modifying the dates on which a special election may be held; amending RCW 29A.04.321, 29A.04.321, 29A.04.330, and 29A.04.330; providing an effective date; and providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29A.04.321 and 2006 c 344 s 2 are each amended to read 7 as follows:

(1) All state, county, city, town, and district general elections 8 9 for the election of federal, state, legislative, judicial, county, 10 city, town, and district officers, and for the submission to the voters 11 of the state, county, city, town, or district of any measure for their adoption and approval or rejection, shall be held on the first Tuesday 12 13 after the first Monday of November, in the year in which they may be A statewide general election shall be held on the first 14 called. 15 Tuesday after the first Monday of November of each year. However, the 16 statewide general election held in odd-numbered years shall be limited to (a) city, town, and district general elections as provided for in 17 RCW 29A.04.330, or as otherwise provided by law; (b) the election of 18 19 federal officers for the remainder of any unexpired terms in the

membership of either branch of the Congress of the United States; (c) 1 2 the election of state and county officers for the remainder of any unexpired terms of offices created by or whose duties are described in 3 4 Article II, section 15, Article III, sections 16, 17, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23, and Article IV, sections 3 and 5 of the state Constitution and 5 RCW 2.06.080; (d) the election of county officers in any county 6 7 governed by a charter containing provisions calling for general county 8 elections at this time; and (e) the approval or rejection of state including proposed constitutional amendments, matters 9 measures, 10 pertaining to any proposed constitutional convention, initiative measures and referendum measures proposed by the electorate, referendum 11 12 bills, and any other matter provided by the legislature for submission 13 to the electorate.

14 (2) A county legislative authority may call a special county 15 election by presenting a resolution to the county auditor prior to the 16 proposed election date. ((Except as provided in subsection (4) of this 17 section,)) <u>A</u> special election called by the county legislative 18 authority shall be held on one of the following dates as decided by 19 such governing body:

(3) A resolution calling for a special election on a date set forth in subsection (2)(a) through $((\frac{d}{d}))$ <u>(c)</u> of this section must be presented to the county auditor at least $((\frac{fifty-two}{d}))$ <u>forty-five</u> days prior to the election date. A resolution calling for a special election on a date set forth in subsection $(2)((\frac{d}{d}))$ <u>(d)</u> or $((\frac{f}{d})))$ <u>(e)</u> of this section must be presented to the county auditor at least eighty-four days prior to the election date.

36 (4) In addition to the dates set forth in subsection (2)(a) through 37 (((f))) (e) of this section, a special election to validate an excess 38 levy or bond issue may be called at any time to meet the needs resulting from fire, flood, earthquake, or other act of God. Such
 county special election shall be noticed and conducted in the manner
 provided by law.

4 (5) ((In a presidential election year, if a presidential preference 5 primary is conducted in February, March, April, or May under chapter 6 29A.56 RCW, the date on which a special election may be called by the 7 county legislative authority under subsection (2) of this section 8 during the month of that primary is the date of the presidential 9 primary.

10 (6)) This section shall supersede the provisions of any and all other statutes, whether general or special in nature, having different 11 12 dates for such city, town, and district elections, the purpose of this 13 section being to establish mandatory dates for holding elections except 14 for those elections held pursuant to a home-rule charter adopted under Article XI, section 4 of the state Constitution. This section shall 15 16 not be construed as fixing the time for holding primary elections, or 17 elections for the recall of any elective public officer.

18 Sec. 2. RCW 29A.04.321 and 2006 c 344 s 2 are each amended to read 19 as follows:

20 (1) All state, county, city, town, and district general elections for the election of federal, state, legislative, judicial, county, 21 city, town, and district officers, and for the submission to the voters 22 23 of the state, county, city, town, or district of any measure for their 24 adoption and approval or rejection, shall be held on the first Tuesday 25 after the first Monday of November, in the year in which they may be 26 called. A statewide general election shall be held on the first 27 Tuesday after the first Monday of November of each year. 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governed by a charter containing provisions calling for general county 1 elections at this time; and (e) the approval or rejection of state 2 3 measures, including proposed constitutional amendments, matters 4 pertaining to any proposed constitutional convention, initiative measures and referendum measures proposed by the electorate, referendum 5 6 bills, and any other matter provided by the legislature for submission 7 to the electorate.

 nonhigh capital fund aid proposals as provided for in chapter 28A.540

6 (c) Consolidation proposals as provided for in RCW 28A.315.235 and 7 nonhigh capital fund aid proposals as provided for in chapter 28A.540 8 RCW.
