- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 Sec. 1. RCW 77.15.192 and 2001 c 1 s 2 are each amended to read as follows:
- The definitions in this section apply throughout RCW 77.15.194 through 77.15.198.
 - (1) "Animal" means any nonhuman vertebrate.
- 9 (2) "Body-gripping trap" means a trap that grips an animal's body
 10 or body part. Body-gripping trap includes, but is not limited to,
 11 steel-jawed leghold traps, padded-jaw leghold traps, Conibear traps,
 12 neck snares, and nonstrangling foot snares. Cage and box traps,
 13 suitcase-type live beaver traps, and ((common rat and mouse)) traps
 14 used to capture old world rats and mice of the family Muridae of the
 15 order Rodentia and new world rats and mice of the family Cricetidae of
- 16 <u>the order Rodentia</u> are not considered body-gripping traps.
- 17 (3) "Person" means a human being and, where appropriate, a public 18 or private corporation, an unincorporated association, a partnership,
- 19 a government, or a governmental instrumentality.

1 (4) "Raw fur" means a pelt that has not been processed for purposes 2 of retail sale.
