- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that, among other
- 5 causes, students who, from one semester to the next, exhibit striking
- 6 behavior or discipline changes or a sudden drop in academic performance
- may have vision impairments. It is the goal of the legislature that,
- 8 to the extent that funds are available, such children be given
- additional vision screening. 9
- Sec. 2. RCW 28A.210.020 and 1971 c 32 s 2 are each amended to read 10 as follows:
- 11
- 12 Every board of school directors shall have the power, and it shall
- be its duty to provide for and require screening for the visual and 13
- 14 auditory acuity of all children attending schools in their districts to
- 15 ascertain which if any of such children have defects sufficient to
- 16 retard them in their studies. Auditory and visual screening shall be
- 17 made in accordance with procedures and standards adopted by rule ((ox
- 18 regulation)) of the state board of health. Those students who exhibit

a striking behavior or discipline change, or a sudden drop in academic 1 performance may be subject to additional visual screening in order to 2 determine whether the change in behavior, discipline, or grades is due 3 to visual impairment. Personnel conducting the additional visual 4 screening shall use a functional vision test in addition to screening 5 6 required by the state board of health. Prior to the adoption or 7 revision of such rules ((or regulations)) the state board of health shall seek the recommendations of the superintendent of public 8 instruction regarding the administration of visual and auditory 9 screening and the qualifications of persons competent to administer 10 11 such screening.
