AN ACT Relating to limiting access to law enforcement and emergency equipment and vehicles; amending RCW 46.37.195; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. It is the intent of the legislature to 6 protect the public to ensure that only federal, state, and local law 7 enforcement and emergency personnel, public or private, or other 8 entities authorized by law to use emergency equipment have access to 9 emergency equipment and vehicles.

10 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.37.195 and 1990 c 94 s 2 are each amended to read 11 as follows:

12 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, a public 13 agency, business, entity, or person shall not sell or give emergency 14 vehicle lighting equipment or other equipment to a person who may not 15 lawfully operate the lighting equipment or other equipment on the 16 public streets and highways. Prior to selling or giving an emergency 17 vehicle to a person or entity that is not a public law enforcement or 18 emergency agency within or outside the state, public law enforcement or

emergency agency in another country, or private ambulance business 1 within or outside the state, the seller or donor must remove all 2 emergency lighting as defined in rules by the Washington state patrol, 3 radios, and any other emergency equipment from the vehicle, except for 4 reflective stripes and paint on fire trucks, that was not originally 5 б installed by the original vehicle manufacturer and that visibly 7 identifies the vehicle as an emergency vehicle from the exterior, including confinement or rear seat safety cages. If the equipment is 8 not retained or transferred to another public law enforcement or 9 emergency agency within or outside the state, public law enforcement or 10 emergency agency in another country, or private ambulance business 11 within or outside the state, the equipment must be dismantled with the 12 13 individual parts being recycled or destroyed prior to being disposed of. The agency must also remove all decals, state and local designated 14 law enforcement colors, and stripes that were not installed by the 15 original vehicle manufacturer. 16

(2) The sale or donation to a broker specializing in the resale of 17 emergency vehicles, or a charitable organization, intending to deliver 18 the vehicle or equipment to a public law enforcement or emergency 19 20 agency within or outside the state, public law enforcement or emergency 21 agency in another country, or private ambulance business within or outside the state, is allowed with the emergency equipment still 22 installed and intact. If the broker or charitable organization sells 23 24 or donates the emergency vehicle to a person or entity that is not a public law enforcement or emergency agency, or private ambulance 25 business, the broker or charitable organization must remove the 26 27 equipment and designations and is accountable and responsible for the removal of the equipment and designations not installed on the vehicle 28 by the original vehicle manufacturer. Equipment not sold or donated to 29 30 a public law enforcement or emergency agency, or a private ambulance business, must be removed and transferred, destroyed, or recycled in 31 32 accordance with subsection (1) of this section.

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
