- AN ACT Relating to membership on the state building code council;
- 2 and amending RCW 19.27.070.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 19.27.070 and 1995 c 399 s 8 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- There is hereby established a state building code council, to be appointed by the governor <u>and subject to confirmation by the senate</u>.
- 8 (1) The state building code council shall consist of fifteen 9 members((τ)):
- 10 <u>(a) Two ((of whom shall)) members must</u> be county elected legislative body members or elected executives ((and));
- 12 <u>(b) Two ((of whom shall)) members must</u> be city elected legislative 13 body members or mayors((\cdot)):
- 14 <u>(c)</u> One ((of the members shall)) <u>member must</u> be a local government 15 building code enforcement official ((and));
- 18 <u>(e) One member shall represent general construction, specializing</u>
 19 in commercial and industrial building construction;

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- - (g) One member shall represent the architectural design profession;
 - (h) One member shall represent the structural engineering profession;
- 6 <u>(i) One member shall represent the mechanical engineering</u> 7 profession;
 - (j) One member shall represent the construction building trades;
- 9 <u>(k) One member shall represent manufacturers, installers, or</u>
 10 suppliers of building materials and components;
 - (1) One member ((shall)) must be a person with a physical disability and shall represent the disability community; and
 - (m) One member shall represent the general public.

- 14 <u>(2)</u> At least six of these fifteen members shall reside east of the 15 crest of the Cascade mountains.
 - (3) The council shall include: Two members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house, one from each caucus; two members of the senate appointed by the president of the senate, one from each caucus; and an employee of the electrical division of the department of labor and industries, as ex officio, nonvoting members with all other privileges and rights of membership.
 - (4)(a) Terms of office shall be for three years, or for so long as the member remains qualified for the appointment.
 - (b) The council shall elect a member to serve as chair of the council for one-year terms of office.
 - (c) Any member who is appointed by virtue of being an elected official or holding public employment shall be removed from the council if he or she ceases being such an elected official or holding such public employment.
 - (d) Any member who is appointed to represent a specific private sector industry must maintain sufficiently similar employment or circumstances throughout the term of office to remain qualified to represent the specified industry. Retirement or unemployment is not cause for termination. However, if a councilmember is no longer employed in the industry he or she was appointed to represent and the councilmember enters into employment in another industry, then he or she shall be removed from the council. If after thirty days from the

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date of the new employment, the member remains on the council, any vote taken by the council is null and void.

(5) Before making any appointments to the building code council, the governor shall seek nominations from recognized organizations which represent the entities or interests ((listed)) identified in this ((subsection)) section. ((Members serving on the council on July 28, 1985, may complete their terms of office. Any vacancy shall be filled by alternating appointments from governmental and nongovernmental entities or interests until the council is constituted as required by this subsection.

 $\frac{(2)}{(6)}$ Members shall not be compensated but shall receive reimbursement for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

(((3))) <u>(7)</u> The department of ((community, trade, and economic development)) <u>commerce</u> shall provide administrative and clerical assistance to the building code council.

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
