 - The office of the superintendent of public instruction shall have authority to monitor, investigate, and prepare complaints for victims of discrimination in public schools based on state laws prohibiting discrimination including sex, race, creed, color, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation as defined in RCW 49.60.040, age, or the presence of any sensory, mental, or physical disability or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a person with a disability, as well as federal laws prohibiting discrimination including Title VI of the civil rights act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C.
