- July 27, 2003,)) the state board of health for temporary food service establishments, but must be tailored specifically to ((these)) poultry slaughter, preparation, and sale activities. The requirements must include, but are not limited to, those for: Cooling procedures, when applicable; sanitary facilities, equipment, and utensils; clean water; washing and other hygienic practices; and waste and wastewater disposal.
- (b) ((The rules must also identify the length of time such a permit is valid. In determining the length of time, the department must take care to ensure that it is adequate to accommodate the seasonal nature of the permitted activities. In adopting any rule under this section, the department must also carefully consider the economic constraints on the regulated activity.)) A permit expires December 31st and may be issued for either one or two years as requested by the permit applicant upon payment of the applicable fee in accordance with subsection (4) of this section.
- (3) The department shall conduct such inspections ((of the activities permitted under this section)) as are reasonably necessary to ensure compliance with permit requirements.
- (4) The fee for a special permit ((issued under this section)) is seventy-five dollars for one year, or one hundred twenty-five dollars for two years.
