AN ACT Relating to internet and mail order sales of certain tobacco products; amending RCW 70.155.010; adding a new section to chapter 70.155 RCW; repealing RCW 70.155.105; and prescribing penalties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 70.155.010 and 2006 c 14 s 2 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 The definitions set forth in RCW 82.24.010 shall apply to ((RCW 70.155.020-through-70.155.130)) this chapter. In addition, for the 9 purposes of this chapter, unless otherwise required by the context:

10 (1) "Board" means the Washington state liquor control board.

(2) (("Delivery sale" means any sale of cigarettes to a consumer in 11 the state where either: (a) The purchaser submits an order for a sale 12 13 by means of a telephonic or other method of voice transmission, mail delivery, any other delivery service, or the internet or other online 14 service; or (b) the cigarettes are delivered by use of mail delivery or 15 16 any other delivery service. A sale of cigarettes shall be a delivery sale regardless of whether the seller is located within or without the 17 state. A sale of cigarettes not for personal consumption to a person 18

1 who-is-a-wholesaler-licensed-pursuant-to-chapter-82.24-RCW-or-a
2 retailer pursuant to chapter 82.24 RCW is not a delivery sale.

3 (3)-"Delivery-service"-means-any-private-carrier-engaged-in-the 4 commercial-delivery-of-letters,-packages,-or-other-containers-that 5 requires the recipient of that letter, package, or container to sign to 6 accept delivery.

7 (4))) "Internet" means any computer network, telephonic network, or 8 other electronic network.

9 <u>(3)</u> "Minor" refers to an individual who is less than eighteen years 10 old.

11 ((<del>(5)</del>)) <u>(4)</u> "Sample" means a tobacco product distributed to members 12 of the general public at no cost or at nominal cost for product 13 promotion purposes.

14 (((-6))) (5) "Sampling" means the distribution of samples to members 15 of the public.

16 ((<del>(7) "Shipping container" means a container in which cigarettes</del> 17 are shipped in connection with a delivery sale.

18 (8) "Shipping documents" means bills of lading, airbills, or any 19 other documents used to evidence the undertaking by a delivery service 20 to deliver letters, packages, or other containers.

(9)) (6) "Tobacco product" means a product that contains tobacco and is intended for human use, including any product defined in RCW 82.24.010(2) or 82.26.010(1), except that for the purposes of section 24 2 of this act only, "tobacco product" does not include cigars defined 25 in RCW 82.26.010 as to which one thousand units weigh more than three 26 pounds.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 70.155 RCW 28 to read as follows:

29 (1) A person may not:

30 (a) Ship or transport, or cause to be shipped or transported, any
 31 tobacco product ordered or purchased by mail or through the internet to
 32 anyone in this state other than a licensed wholesaler or retailer; or

(b) With knowledge or reason to know of the violation, provide
substantial assistance to a person who is in violation of this section.
(2)(a) A person who knowingly violates subsection (1) of this
section is guilty of a class C felony, except that the maximum fine
that may be imposed is five thousand dollars.

1 (b) In addition to or in lieu of any other civil or criminal remedy 2 provided by law, a person who has violated subsection (1) of this 3 section is subject to a civil penalty of up to five thousand dollars 4 for each violation. The attorney general, acting in the name of the 5 state, may seek recovery of the penalty in a civil action in superior 6 court. For purposes of this subsection, each shipment or transport of 7 tobacco products constitutes a separate violation.

8 (3) The attorney general may seek an injunction in superior court 9 to restrain a threatened or actual violation of subsection (1) of this 10 section and to compel compliance with subsection (1) of this section.

(4) Any violation of subsection (1) of this section is not 11 reasonable in relation to the development and preservation of business 12 13 and is an unfair and deceptive act or practice and an unfair method of 14 competition in the conduct of trade or commerce in violation of RCW 19.86.020. Standing to bring an action to enforce RCW 19.86.020 for 15 violation of subsection (1) of this section lies solely with the 16 17 attorney general. Remedies provided by chapter 19.86 RCW are cumulative and not exclusive. 18

19 (5)(a) In any action brought under this section, the state is 20 entitled to recover, in addition to other relief, the costs of 21 investigation, expert witness fees, costs of the action, and reasonable 22 attorneys' fees.

(b) If a court determines that a person has violated subsection (1) of this section, the court shall order any profits, gain, gross receipts, or other benefit from the violation to be disgorged and paid to the state treasurer for deposit in the general fund.

(6) Unless otherwise expressly provided, the penalties or remedies,
or both, under this section are in addition to any other penalties and
remedies available under any other law of this state.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. RCW 70.155.105 (Delivery sale of 31 cigarettes--Requirements, unlawful practices--Penalties--Enforcement) 32 and 2003 c 113 s 2 are each repealed.
