5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 47.38 RCW 6 to read as follows:

The department may work with human trafficking victim advocates in 7 8 developing informational posters for placement in rest areas. The department may adopt policies for the placement of these posters in 9 10 rest areas and these policies must address, at a minimum, placement of 11 the posters in bathroom stalls.
