1 AN ACT Relating to the Washington soldiers' home; and amending RCW
2 72.36.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 72.36.010 and 1959 c 28 s 72.36.010 are each amended
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) There is established at Orting, Pierce county, an institution
7 which shall be known as the Washington soldiers' home.

8 (2) The department is authorized to work with public or private
9 entities on projects to make the best use of the soldiers' home
10 property and facilities. These projects may include, but are not
11 limited to, the renovation and long-term lease of the Garfield barracks
12 building on the soldiers' home campus.

13 (3) All long-term leases of the soldiers' home property shall be
14 subject to the requirements of RCW 43.82.010, except that such leases
15 may run for up to seventy-five years.
