1            AN ACT Relating to state agency rule-making information; and adding  
2 a new section to chapter 34.05 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            NEW SECTION.    **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 34.05 RCW  
5 to read as follows:

6            Within existing resources, each state agency shall maintain a web  
7 site that contains the agency's rule-making information. A direct link  
8 to the agency's rule-making page must be displayed on the agency's  
9 homepage. The rule-making web site shall include the complete text of  
10 all proposed rules, emergency rules, and permanent rules proposed or  
11 adopted within the past twelve months, or include a direct link to the  
12 index page on the Washington State Register web site that contains  
13 links to the complete text of all proposed rules, emergency rules, and  
14 permanent rules proposed or adopted within the past twelve months by  
15 that state agency. For proposed rules, the time, date, and place for  
16 the rule-making hearing and the procedures and timelines for submitting  
17 written comments and supporting data must be posted on the web site.
