AN ACT Relating to insurance requirements for higher education students participating in study or research abroad; and amending RCW 3 28B.10.660.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 28B.10.660 and 1993 sp.s. c 9 s 1 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) The governing boards of any of the state's institutions of 8 higher education may make available liability, life, health, health care, accident, disability and salary protection or insurance or any 9 10 one of, or a combination of, the enumerated types of insurance, or any other type of insurance or protection, for the regents or trustees and 11 12 students of the institution. Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3) of this section, the premiums due on such protection or insurance 13 14 shall be borne by the assenting regents, trustees, or students. The regents or trustees of any of the state institutions of higher 15 education may make liability insurance available for employees of the 16 institutions. The premiums due on such liability insurance shall be 17 18 borne by the university or college.

1 (2) A governing board of a public four-year institution of higher 2 education may make available, and pay the costs of, health benefits for 3 graduate students holding graduate service appointments, designated as 4 such by the institution. Such health benefits may provide coverage for 5 spouses and dependents of such graduate student appointees.

(3) A governing board of a state institution of higher education 6 may require its students who participate in studies or research outside 7 of the United States sponsored, arranged, or approved by the 8 institution\_to\_purchase, as a condition\_of\_participation, insurance 9 approved by the governing board, that will provide coverage for 10 expenses arising from emergency evacuation, repatriation of remains, 11 12 injury, illness, or death sustained while participating in the study or 13 research abroad. The governing board of the institution may bear all or part of the costs of the insurance. A student shall not be required 14 to purchase insurance if the student is covered under an insurance 15 policy that will provide coverage for expenses arising from emergency 16 evacuation, repatriation of remains, injury, illness, or death 17 sustained while participating in the study or research abroad. 18 Passed by the Senate April 20, 2009.
