1 AN ACT Relating to rendering criminal assistance in the first
2 degree; amending RCW 9A.76.070; creating a new section; and prescribing
3 penalties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.76.070 and 2003 c 53 s 83 are each amended to read
6 as follows:

7 (1) A person is guilty of rendering criminal assistance in the
8 first degree if he or she renders criminal assistance to a person who
9 has committed or is being sought for murder in the first degree or any
10 class A felony or equivalent juvenile offense.

11 (2)(a) Except as provided in (b) of this subsection, rendering
12 criminal assistance in the first degree is a class ((C)) B felony.

13 (b) Rendering criminal assistance in the first degree is a gross
14 misdemeanor if it is established by a preponderance of the evidence
15 that the actor is a relative as defined in RCW 9A.76.060 and under the
16 age of eighteen at the time of the offense.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** This act may be known and cited as Randy's
2 law.
