1 AN ACT Relating to modifying the transportation system policy 2 goals; and amending RCW 47.04.280.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.04.280 and 2007 c 516 s 3 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) It is the intent of the legislature to establish policy goals 7 for the planning, operation, performance of, and investment in, the 8 state's transportation system. The policy goals established under this 9 section are deemed consistent with the benchmark categories adopted by 10 the state's blue ribbon commission on transportation on November 30, 11 2000. Public investments in transportation should support achievement 12 of these policy goals:

13 (a) <u>Economic vitality: To promote and develop transportation</u> 14 <u>systems that stimulate, support, and enhance the movement of people and</u> 15 <u>goods to ensure a prosperous economy;</u>

16 (b) Preservation: To maintain, preserve, and extend the life and 17 utility of prior investments in transportation systems and services; 18 (((b))) <u>(c)</u> Safety: To provide for and improve the safety and

19 security of transportation customers and the transportation system;

1 (((+c+))) (d) Mobility: To improve the predictable movement of goods
2 and people throughout Washington state;

3 (((d))) (e) Environment: To enhance Washington's quality of life 4 through transportation investments that promote energy conservation, 5 enhance healthy communities, and protect the environment; and

6 (((e))) <u>(f)</u> Stewardship: To continuously improve the quality,
7 effectiveness, and efficiency of the transportation system.

8 (2) The powers, duties, and functions of state transportation 9 agencies must be performed in a manner consistent with the policy goals 10 set forth in subsection (1) of this section.

11 (3) These policy goals are intended to be the basis for 12 establishing detailed and measurable objectives and related performance 13 measures.

14 (4) It is the intent of the legislature that the office of financial management establish objectives and performance measures for 15 department of transportation and other state agencies with 16 the 17 transportation-related responsibilities to ensure transportation system performance at local, regional, and state government levels progresses 18 toward the attainment of the policy goals set forth in subsection (1) 19 The office of financial management shall submit 20 of this section. 21 initial objectives and performance measures to the legislature for its 22 review and shall provide copies of the same to the commission during the 2008 legislative session. The office of financial management shall 23 24 submit objectives and performance measures to the legislature for its 25 review and shall provide copies of the same to the commission during each regular session of the legislature during an even-numbered year 26 27 thereafter.
