Creating the uniform limited partnership act.

(DĬGEST OF PROPOSĖD 1ST SŪBSTITUTE)

Creates the uniform limited partnership act, effective January 1, 2010.

Repeals the existing uniform limited partnership act, effective July 1, 2010.

Sec. 7003(b); and

(2) Applies to guardianship and protective proceedings begun on or after the effective date of the act.

Provides that sections 1 through 6 and 16 through 22 of the act apply to proceedings filed on or after January 1, 2010, regardless of whether a guardianship or protective order has been issued.

Regarding dispensing and administration of drugs to registered or licensed veterinary personnel.

Allows a veterinarian legally prescribing drugs to delegate to a licensed veterinary technician, while under the veterinarian's indirect supervision, certain nondiscretionary functions defined by the Washington state veterinary board of governors and used in the dispensing of legend drugs, nonlegend drugs, and controlled substances associated with the practice of veterinary medicine.

Provides that, to effectuate the legislature's goal of protecting public safety, as provided in RCW 71.05.010, within the context of the Washington state supreme court's holding in *In re Harris*, 98 Wn.2d 276 (1982), the legislature intends that a trier of fact determining whether a person presents a likelihood of serious harm has the ability to consider a respondent's recent and past acts where such acts would indicate a substantial risk to public safety.

Establishing a process for providing notice to a contact person in the event a person is injured and requires emergency care.

Directs the department of licensing to publish notice at its offices and on its web site that it provides and maintains an electronic registry where a person may enter the name of a contact person to be contacted in the event the person is in need of or receives emergency care as the result of an accident, criminal act, or other cause.

Provides that: (1) The legislature recognizes the significant concerns that many victims, survivors of victims, and witnesses of crimes have when offenders are considered for postsentence release from confinement; and

(2) It is the intent of the legislature to ensure that victims, survivors of victims, and witnesses of crimes are afforded the opportunity to make a statement that will be considered

before the granting of postsentence release from confinement for any offender under the jurisdiction of the indeterminate sentence review board or its successor, or by the governor regarding an application for pardon or commutation of sentence.

Creating a school-based influenza vaccination pilot program.

Requires the department of health and the office of the superintendent of public instruction to jointly establish a school-based influenza vaccination pilot program using both killed vaccine and live attenuated vaccine in one urban school district and one rural school district.

Directs the department of health to convene a working group to plan the school-based influenza vaccination pilot program.

Expires July 1, 2011.

Concerning property tax relief for senior citizens and persons retired because of physical disability.

Provides property tax relief for senior citizens and persons retired because of physical disability.

Provides that the act applies to taxes levied for collection in 2011 and thereafter.

Promoting economic development and community revitalization.

Expands the community revitalization program to allow local governments to finance public improvements.

Limits the annual aggregate amount of new local sales and use taxes that may be credited against the state tax.

HB 1286 by Representatives Miloscia, Appleton, Armstrong, Hunt, Newhouse, White, Smith, Rolfes, Roberts, Nelson, Hinkle, and Ormsby; by request of Public Disclosure Commission

Prohibiting false and defamatory statements about candidates for public office.

Provides that it is the intent of the legislature to amend chapter 42.17 RCW to find that a violation of state law occurs if a person sponsors false statements about candidates in political advertising and electioneering communications when the statements are made with actual malice and are defamatory.

Finds that in such circumstances damages are presumed and do not need to be established when such statements are made with actual malice in political advertising and electioneering communications and constitute libel or defamation per se.

Exempting the annual parental declaration of intent to home school from the public disclosure act.

Exempts from public disclosure the annual declaration of intent filed by parents under RCW 28A.200.010 for a child to receive home-based instruction.

Prohibits a person or entity that is regulated by, contracts with, leases to, or sells commodities to the public lands commission from, directly or indirectly, paying or using, or offering, consenting, or agreeing to pay or use any money or thing of value for or in aid of any candidate for the office of public lands commissioner.

Provides penalties.

Concerning local tourism promotion areas.

Exempts the furnishing of lodging at a new lodging facility located within a tourism promotion area from the charge imposed under chapter 35.101 RCW unless the lodging business submits a petition to the legislative authority indicating that lodging furnished at the new lodging facility will be subject to the charge.

HB 1292 by Representatives Newhouse, Chandler, and Simpson

Authorizing waivers from the one hundred eighty-day school year requirement in order to allow four-day school weeks.

Finds that school districts are seeking innovations to reduce operating costs and preserve limited resources for the primary purpose of student learning. Efficiencies in transportation, heat, lights, maintenance, and food expenses are possible from operating for four rather than five days per week, but current law poses a barrier to this innovation by requiring a set number of instructional days in each school year.

Declares an intent to permit school districts to seek waivers from the school year requirement in order to operate on a four-day school week, provided that adequate safeguards are put in place to prevent any negative impact on student learning.

Allows the state board of education to grant waivers from the requirement for a one hundred eighty-day school year under RCW 28A.150.220 and 28A.150.250 to school districts that propose to operate one or more schools on a four-day school week for purposes of economy and efficiency as provided in the act.

Expires section 2 of the act on August 31, 2015.

Modifying whistleblower protection provisions.

Provides that a public employee must not be prohibited or otherwise restricted in providing information or expressing opinions to state or local elected officials, or to courts or law enforcement, on matters of public concern, nor be subject to acts of retaliation because the employee has expressed such opinions.

#### **HB 1295** by Representatives Warnick and Upthegrove

Annexing areas used for agricultural fairs.

Declares an intent to establish clear and logical annexation procedures for the annexation of county-owned fairgrounds that are consistent with the longstanding legal requirement that these grounds may only be annexed with the consent of the majority of the board of county commissioners.

HB 1296 by Representatives Williams, Warnick, Goodman, McCune, Rodne, Simpson, and Kelley

Providing limitations on rental housing inspections.

Prohibits a local government from requiring or permitting a landlord to engage or hire a third party to conduct inspections or searches of dwelling units and common areas under RCW 59.18.150. A local government may not assess the cost of an inspection by a local building official under RCW 59.18.150 against the landlord or owner.

HB 1297 by Representatives Simpson, Orcutt, Sullivan, Warnick, and McCune

Concerning the excise taxation of bullion and rare earth metals.

Declares an intent to reimplement the original intention of the legislature and limit the business and occupation tax imposed on the business of making sales of precious metal bullion to a tax on amounts received as commissions and not to tax the activity of reforming precious metal bullion into different shapes or sizes.

Declares that the business and occupation tax applies to the markup on the sale of precious metal bullion, where the taxpayer is selling its own precious metal bullion.

Declares an intent to accord the same tax treatment to investment purchases of rare earth metals.

Provides that the act applies both retroactively and prospectively.

Limiting utility liens against rental property.

Concerning local government crime-free rental housing programs.

Finds that local governments, landlords, and tenants working together to provide crime-free rental housing is beneficial to the public health, safety, and welfare.

Declares an intent to provide certain requirements that a local government must follow in adopting a crime-free rental housing program and to provide landlords with a tool to stop criminal activity on their property.

Authorizes a city, town, or county to adopt and implement a local government crime-free rental housing program designed to reduce crime, drugs, and gangs on rental properties.

HB 1300 by Representatives Hurst, Dickerson, Pearson, Klippert, O'Brien, and Smith

Access to mental health information.

Directs a mental health service provider or its legal counsel to release to law enforcement officers, personnel of a county or city jail, public health officers, personnel of the department of corrections or the indeterminate sentence review board, prosecuting attorneys, attorneys retained to represent a person who is the subject of an information request under the act, or the court, upon request, information related to mental health services delivered to a person who: (1) Is currently committed to the custody or supervision of the department of corrections or the indeterminate sentence review board under chapter 9.94A or 9.95 RCW;

- (2) Has been convicted of a serious violent offense;
- (3) Has been found not guilty by reason of insanity or incompetent to stand trial for a serious violent offense pursuant to chapter 10.77 RCW; or
- (4) Has been civilly committed pursuant to RCW 10.77.086(4).
