House Bills

HB 2318-S2 by House Committee on Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Representatives Sells, Ericks, Kenney, Liias, Simpson, Hope, McCoy, Conway, and Roberts)

Creating the Washington institute of aerospace technology and manufacturing studies.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 2ND SUBSTITUTE)

Creates the Washington institute of aerospace technology and advanced manufacturing to improve the state's aerospace training, education, research, and development programs by coordinating, providing, and developing curriculum for a statewide consortium of schools and programs that provide aerospace workforce education and training.

Requires the institute to be headquartered in Snohomish county and initially administered by the board of trustees of Edmonds Community College.

HB 2348-S by House Committee on Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Representatives Moeller and Ormsby)

Regarding surcharges on fee-based activities related to public health.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires a surcharge of eight dollars to be charged to each transaction related to the purchase of certified copies of birth and death certificates. Expires June 30, 2011.

HB 2382 by Representatives Santos, Moeller, Morrell, Cody, Kretz, Hinkle, Armstrong, Walsh, and

Cox

Concerning the taxation of moist snuff.

Establishes weight, rather than wholesale price, as the measure of tobacco products tax on moist snuff.

Imposes the tax at a rate that is equivalent to cigarette tax, with a specified minimum of tax on each consumer-sized package.

Dedicates any new revenue attributable to the act to the health services account, to the extent possible, while keeping other accounts whole.

Declares that the legislature recognizes the role that tax policy plays in the levels of consumption of moist snuff by youth due to impacts on price. Discouraging youth access to moist snuff and youth consumption is an important state policy. The legislature directs the department of health, with the assistance of the department of revenue and the office of financial management, to study this issue.

SB 6116-S by Senate Committee on Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senators Murray and Kohl-Welles)

Concerning excise taxes in a county with a population of one million five hundred thousand or more and a county east of the crest of the Cascade mountains that has pledged lodging tax revenue for payment of bonds prior to June 26, 1975.

Addresses excise taxes in a county with a population of one million five hundred thousand or more and a county east of the crest of the Cascade mountains that has pledged lodging tax revenue for payment of bonds prior to June 26, 1975.

SB 6186 by Senator Shin

Providing that notes and information compiled during traffic stops are available for public inspection.

Provides that any notes or information compiled during a traffic stop by law enforcement is not subject to the public inspection and copying exemption in chapter 42.56 RCW (public records act).
