House Bills

HB 1755-S by House Committee on Judiciary (originally sponsored by Representatives Williams, Rodne, and Upthegrove)

Including correctional employees who have completed government-sponsored law enforcement firearms training to the lists of law enforcement personnel that are exempt from certain firearm restrictions.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Exempts from certain firearm restrictions: (1) Correctional personnel who have completed government-sponsored law enforcement firearms training; and

(2) Correctional personnel who have completed the firearms training and who are retired for service or physical disabilities, unless they retired because of mental or stress-related disabilities.

Modifies the process for issuing firearms certificates to Washington residents who are otherwise qualified retired law enforcement officers.

Adopting policy recommendations developed by the sustainable recreation work group.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Adopts certain policy recommendations developed by the sustainable recreation work group that are capable of being implemented in the near term and that may provide near-term benefits to sustainable recreation or additional information that may be used to improve recreational activities in Washington.

Requires the department of natural resources to: (1) Convey the responsibility to operate or maintain recreation facilities to a concessionaire; and

(2) Initiate two private concessionaire pilot projects to better understand how private concessionaires could be compatible with the department's tradition of providing primitive, relatively dispersed recreation experiences and whether allowing concessionaires access to well-suited campgrounds could improve the quality of service provided while reducing management costs to the department.

Requires the department of natural resources, the department of fish and wildlife, and the state parks and recreation commission to formally explore how the three agencies can develop and implement a multiagency pass that would allow the holder to access any fee-based recreational lands or facilities managed by any one of the agencies in lieu of paying a separate access fee to an individual agency.

Requires the department of commerce, in consultation with the affordable housing advisory board, to prepare and from time to time amend a state affordable housing for all plan.

(3) Ensure students will have an opportunity to learn the mathematics and science assessments being assessed.

Simplifies the approval process for shoreline master programs adopted by local authorities.

Streamlines the approval process and reduces costly obligations borne by the department of ecology.

Concerning impact payments of a municipally owned hydroelectric facility.

Requires certain municipal-owned utilities, that construct or operate hydroelectric generating facilities or acquire land for the purpose of constructing or operating the same in a county other than the county in which the city is located, to enter into an agreement with the county affected for the annual payment of moneys to recompense such losses or provide for such increased financial burden equivalent to seven percent of the annual utility taxes paid by the municipal-owned utility.
